Uncle (n)	The brother of someone's mother or father, or the husband of someone's aunt or uncle.	My aunt and uncle moved to Arizona when they retired.
Aunt (n)	The sister of someone's mother or father, or the wife of someone's uncle.	I have an aunt in Australia.
Child (n)	A boy or girl from the time of birth until he or she is an adult, or a son or daughter of any age.	As a child I didn't eat vegetables.
Son (n)	A male child.	This is our son Raja.
Daughter (n)	A female child.	We have a son and a daughter .

Second (n)	A short unit of time that is equal to a 60th of a minute.	The computer takes a few seconds to power up.
Minute (n)	Any of the 60 parts that an hour is divided into; 60 seconds.	It takes me 20 minutes to get to school.
Hour (n)	A period of 60 minutes.	The exam lasted an hour and a half.
Day (n)	A period of 24 hours.	January has 31 days .
Week (n)	A period of seven days.	We go to the cinema about once a week .
Month (n)	A period of about four weeks, especially one of the twelve periods into which a year is divided.	February is the shortest month .
Year (n)	A period of twelve months, especially from 1 January to 31 December.	We went to Egypt on holiday last year .
Century (n)	A period of 100 years.	Life in the 19th century was very different from what it is now.

Word	Meaning	Example
Downstairs (n)	To or on a lower floor of a building, especially the ground floor.	I went downstairs to answer the phone.
Flat (n)	A set of rooms for living in that are part of a larger building and are usually all on one floor.	They have a house in the country and a flat in Manchester.
Front door (n)	The main entrance to a building, especially a house, usually facing the road.	The second front door was at the top of the stairs.
Garage (n)	A building where a car is kept, built next to or as part of a house.	Did you put the car in the garage ?
Garden (n)	A piece of land, usually in a yard next to a house, where you grow flowers and vegetables.	The house has a large back garden , and a small front garden .
Upstairs (n)	The highest floor or floors of a building.	He's upstairs doing his homework.
Walls (n)	A vertical structure that divides or encloses something.	We'd like the walls painted white.
Window (n)	An opening in the wall of a building or vehicle, usually covered with glass, to let light and air in and to allow people inside to see out.	From her bedroom window she could see a lovely garden.
