#### Past simple and used to

#### Past simple

We use the past simple to talk about something started and finished in the past.

**Time expressions:** Yesterday / Last ..... / ..... ago / in 2011 / at the weekend / On day / every five or six weeks.

**Example:** I walked to school yesterday.
