Adjectives and adverbs

Adjectives:

Adjectives are words that describe or modify nouns or pronouns.

They provide more information about the characteristics, qualities, or attributes of the noun they are modifying.

Adjectives answer questions such as "What kind?", "Which one?", or "How many?".

Examples: beautiful, tall, happy, blue, five.

Adverbs:

Adverbs are words that modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs.

They provide information about how, when, where, or to what extent an action or quality is performed.

Adverbs answer questions such as "How?", "When?", "Where?", or "To what extent?".

Adverbs often end in "-ly", but there are exceptions.

Examples: quickly, carefully, often, there, very.

Comparative & superlative; (as ... not as)

Comparative

The comparative form is used to compare two people, things, or actions to determine which has a greater or lesser degree of a particular quality.

Example:

My car is faster than yours.

The blue dress is more beautiful than the red one.

<u>Superlative</u>

The superlative is a form of an adjective or adverb that is used to compare three or more things or people. It is used to express the highest degree of a quality or attribute.

Example:

- He is the smartest student in the class.
- She is the kindest person I know.
