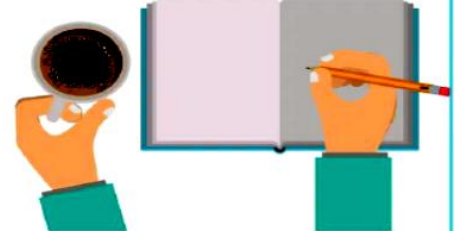

Food from Another Country

Kerala in India is known to be called the *Land of Spices*. There are many different cultures in Kerala so there are many influences on the flavours. They have delicious sauces which are made from a wonderful variety of ingredients. For example, garlic, ginger and cloves.
