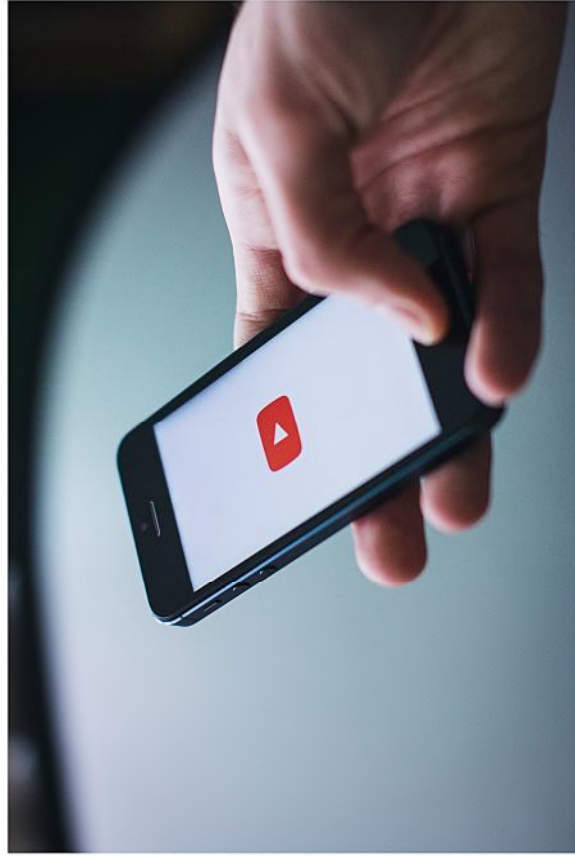




website

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: pages on the internet where someone puts information
- Pronunciation: /'websaɪt/
- Syllables & Stress: **web**-site
- Example: This website is good for shopping.



app

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a small computer program on a mobile phone or other device
- Pronunciation: /æp/
- Syllables & Stress: **app**
- Example: I have a new app for learning English.

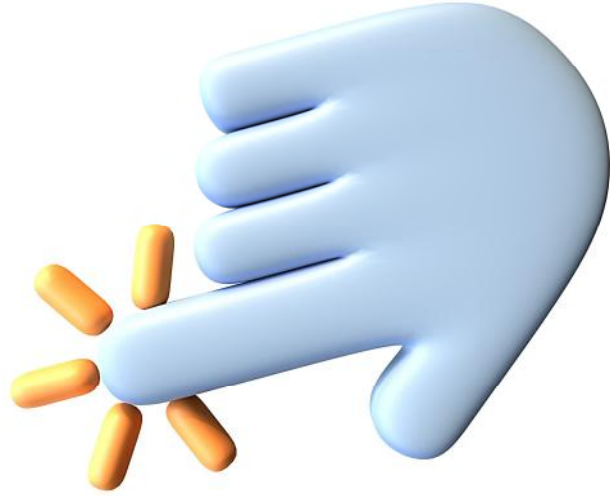
button

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: the thing you press to make something work
- Pronunciation: /'bʌtn/
- Syllables & Stress: **but**-ton
- Example: Press the button to start the computer.



camera

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a piece of equipment used to take photographs or to make films
- Pronunciation: /'kæməɾə/
- Syllables & Stress: **cam**-e-ra
- Example: She has a new camera.



challenge

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to try something difficult to test your skills
- Pronunciation: /ˈtʃælɪndʒ/
- Syllables & Stress: **chal**-lenge
- Example: I want to challenge myself with a puzzle



click

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to press part of a device, e.g. a computer, to make it do something
- Pronunciation: /klɪk/
- Syllables & Stress: **click**
- Example: Click the icon to open the file.

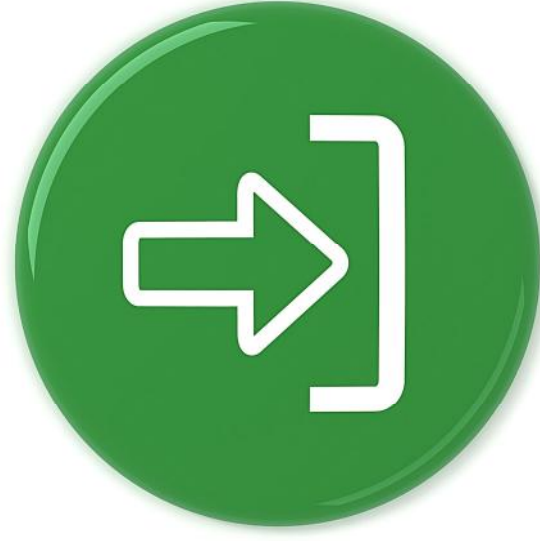
computer

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: an electronic machine that can store and arrange lots of information
- Pronunciation: /kəmˈpjʊ:tə/
- Syllables & Stress: com-**pu**-ter
- Example: I use a computer to play games.



device

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: an electronic gadget, e.g. a phone or a tablet
- Pronunciation: /dɪˈvaɪs/
- Syllables & Stress: de-**vice**
- Example: The phone is a useful device.



digital

- Word Type: adjective
- Definition: involving computers or electronic technology
- Pronunciation: /ˈdɪdʒɪtl/
- Syllables & Stress: **dig**-i-tal
- Example: We use digital cameras at school.



- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to copy computer programs, or other information from the internet to your device
- Pronunciation: /ˌdaʊnˈlɒd/
- Syllables & Stress: down-**load**
- Example: I will download a new game tonight.

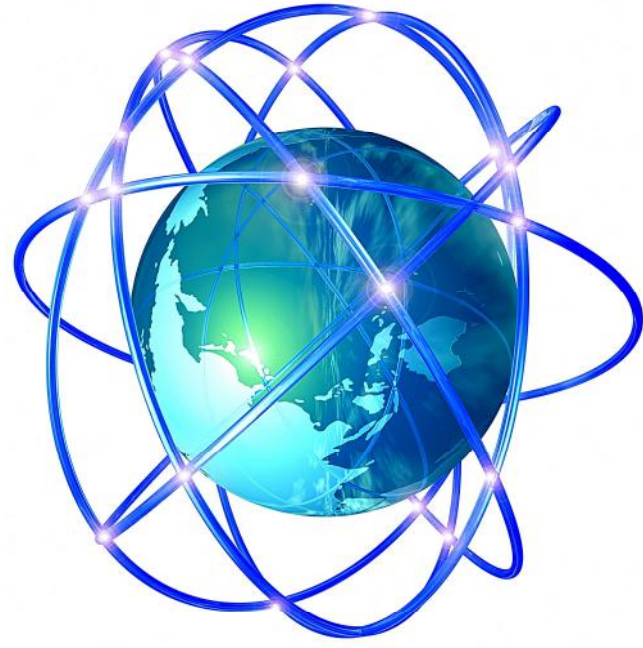
e-reader

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a device for reading digital books and magazines
- Pronunciation: /ˈiːrɪˌdɜː/
- Syllables & Stress: e-read-er
- Example: She reads stories on her e-reader.



download headphones

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a device worn on the head to listen to sound from a phone or other device
- Pronunciation: /ˈhedfəʊnz/
- Syllables & Stress: **head**-phones
- Example: I listen to music with my headphones.



icon

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a small picture on a computer screen that you choose to make the computer do something
- Pronunciation: /'aɪkən/
- Syllables & Stress: **i**-con
- Example: Click the icon to open the app.



- Word Type: noun
- Definition: the system that connects computers all over the world and lets people look at websites
- Pronunciation: /'ɪntənɪt/
- Syllables & Stress: **in**-ter-net
- Example: The internet is useful for studying.

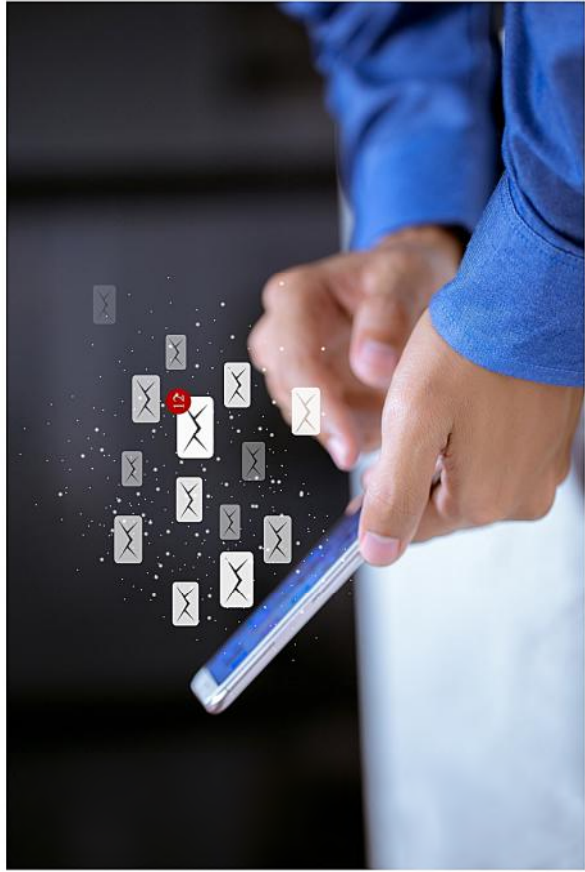
laptop

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a small computer that you can carry around
- Pronunciation: /'læptɒp/
- Syllables & Stress: **lap**-top
- Example: I do my homework on my laptop.



internet message

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: an email or text you send to someone
- Pronunciation: /'mesɪdʒ/
- Syllables & Stress: **mes**-sage
- Example: She sent me a message on my phone.



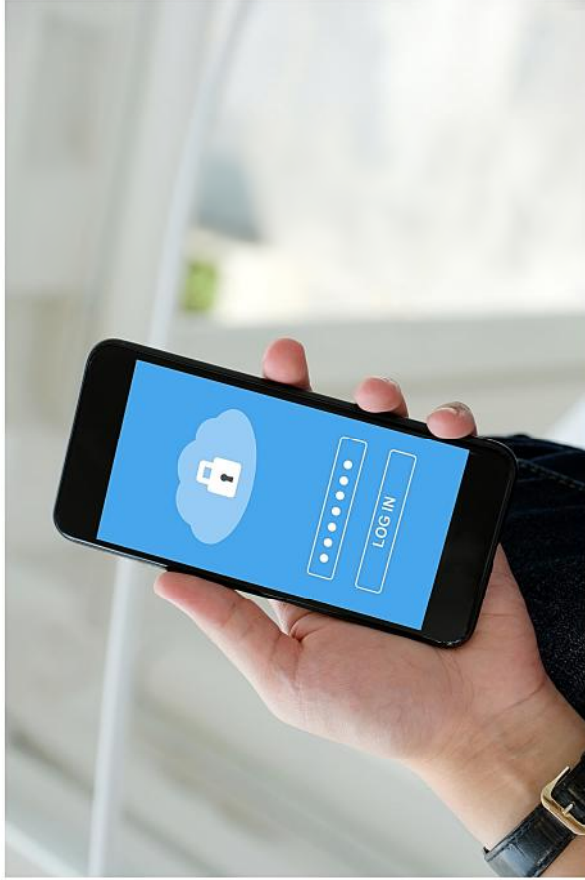
online

- Word Type: adjective
- Definition: connected to the internet
- Pronunciation: /ˌɒnˈlaɪn/
- Syllables & Stress: on-line
- Example: I often buy books online.



password

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a secret word that lets you do something, e.g. use your computer
- Pronunciation: /ˈpɑːswɜːd/
- Syllables & Stress: pass-word
- Example: Never share your password with others.



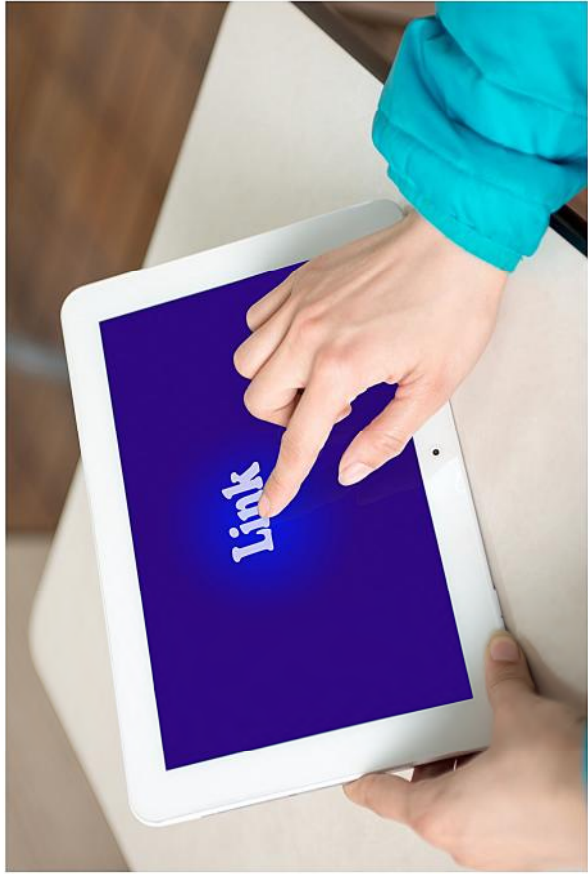
photo

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a picture a camera makes
- Pronunciation: /ˈfəʊtəʊ/
- Syllables & Stress: pho-to
- Example: This is a photo of my family.



press

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to push something
- Pronunciation: /pres/
- Syllables & Stress: press
- Example: Press the key to type a letter.



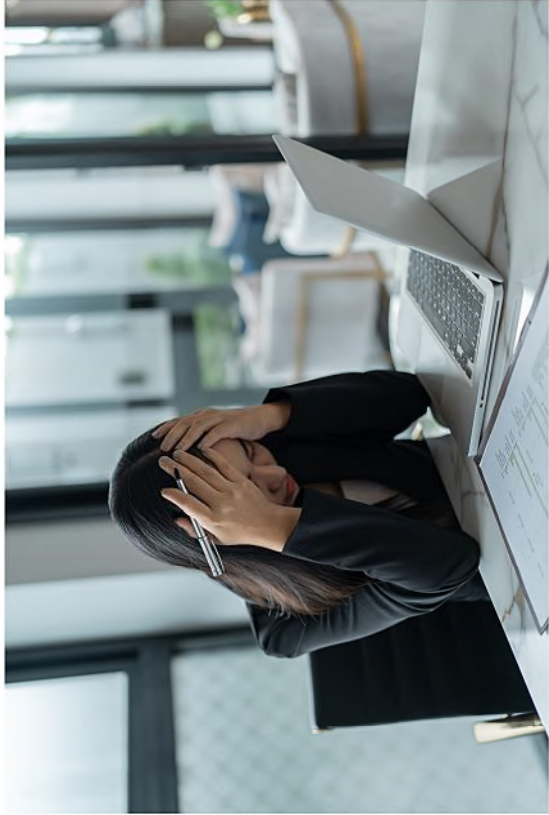
printer

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a machine that makes copies of documents, pictures or photos on paper
- Pronunciation: /ˈprɪntə/
- Syllables & Stress: **print**-er
- Example: The printer is next to the computer.



problem

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a difficult situation
- Pronunciation: /ˈprɒbləm/
- Syllables & Stress: **prob**-lem
- Example: I have a problem with my homework.



program

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to write or create instructions for a computer
- Pronunciation: /ˈprəʊɡræm/
- Syllables & Stress: **pro**-gram
- Example: He can program a simple game.



score

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to get points in a game
- Pronunciation: /skoː/
- Syllables & Stress: **score**
- Example: He will score a goal in the match.



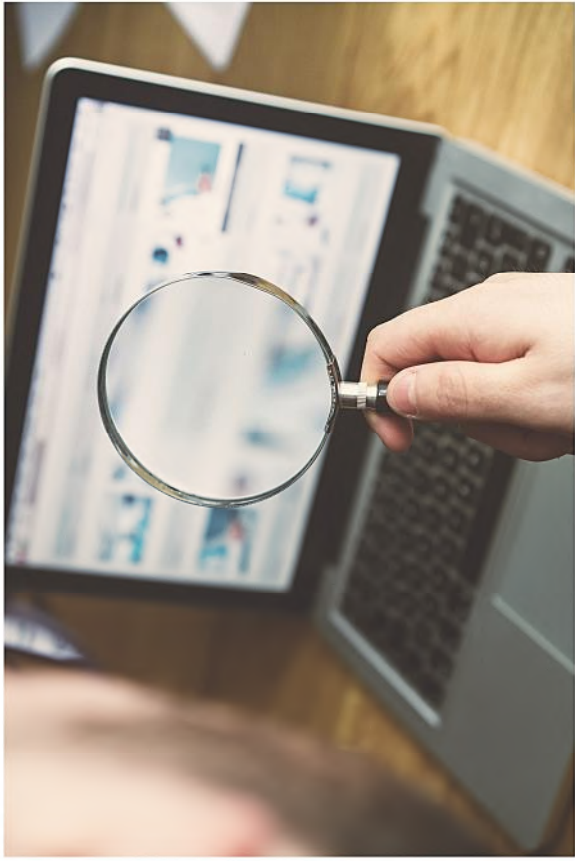
screen

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: the part of a TV or computer that shows images
- Pronunciation: /skri:n/
- Syllables & Stress: **screen**
- Example: The screen is very big.



search

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to look for something
- Pronunciation: /sɜ:tʃ/
- Syllables & Stress: **search**
- Example: I will search for the word in the dictionary.



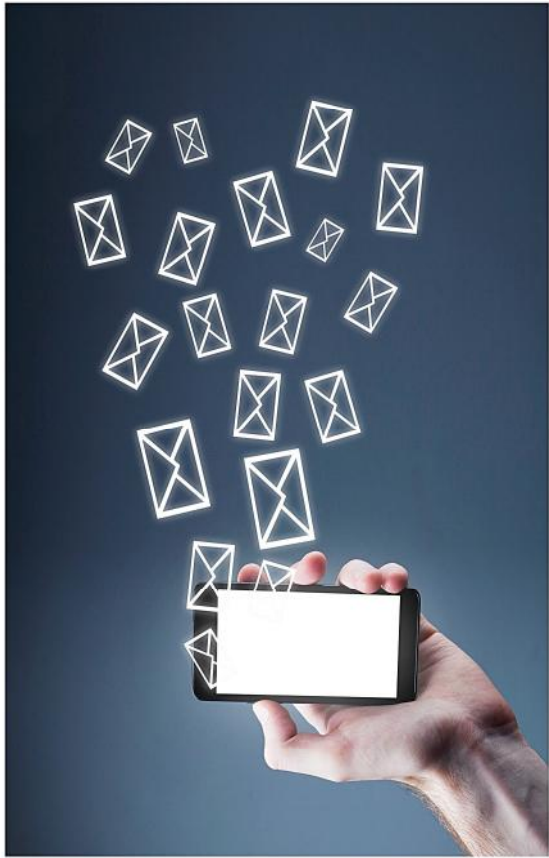
selfie

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a photo that you take of yourself, usually with a mobile phone
- Pronunciation: /'selfi/
- Syllables & Stress: **sel**-fie
- Example: She took a selfie with her friends.



send

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to give something to someone, by mail or electronically
- Pronunciation: /send/
- Syllables & Stress: **send**
- Example: Please send me the file.



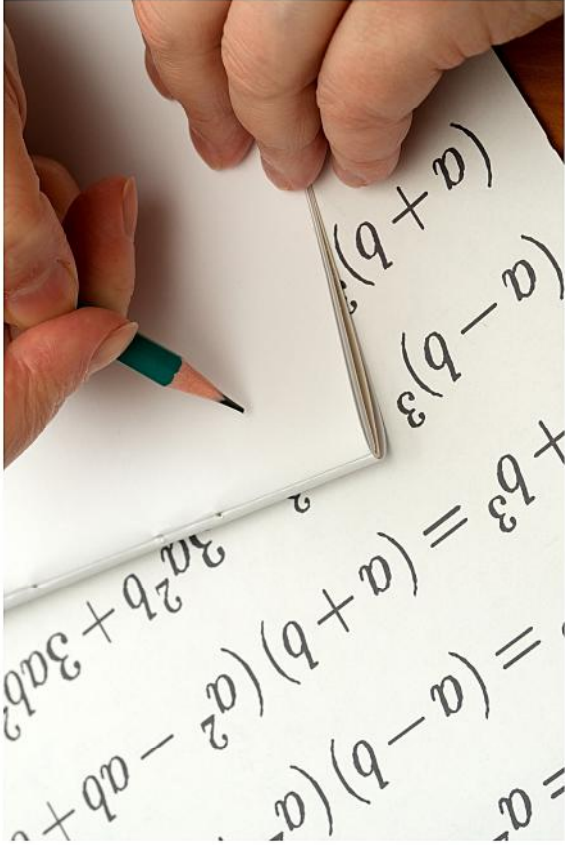
smartphone

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a mobile phone that is like a small computer and that connects to the internet
- Pronunciation: /ˈsmɑːtfəʊn/
- Syllables & Stress: **smart**-phone
- Example: My smartphone is very fast.



solve

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to find an answer
- Pronunciation: /sɒlv/
- Syllables & Stress: **solve**
- Example: She can solve the math problem.



speaker

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: the part of a computer or smartphone which the sound comes out of
- Pronunciation: /ˈspiːkə/
- Syllables & Stress: **spea**-ker
- Example: The speaker is very loud.



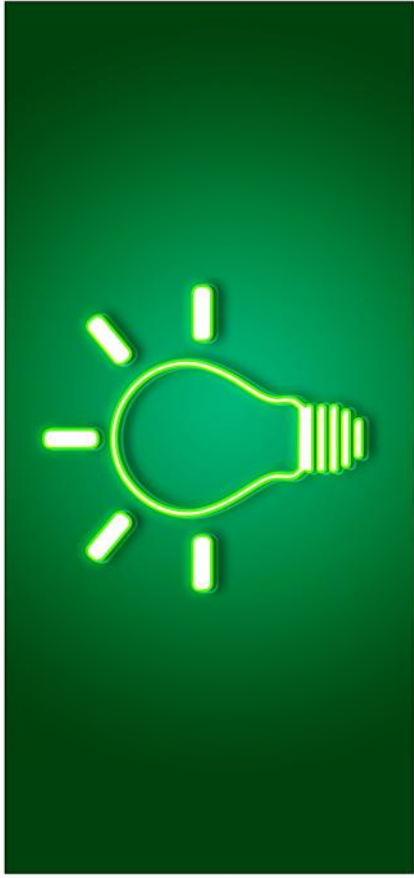
technology

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: knowledge and equipment that are used in science and industry
- Pronunciation: /tekˈnɒlədʒi/
- Syllables & Stress: tech-**nol**-o-gy
- Example: Technology helps us learn faster.



tip

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a piece of helpful advice
- Pronunciation: /tɪp/
- Syllables & Stress: **tip**
- Example: Here is a good tip for studying.



turn off

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to move the switch on a machine so that it stops working
- Pronunciation: /tɜ:n ɒf/
- Syllables & Stress: **turn** off
- Example: Please turn off the alarm.



turn on

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to move the switch on a machine so that it starts working
- Pronunciation: /tɜ:n ɒn/
- Syllables & Stress: **turn** on
- Example: He will turn on the lights.



TV

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: a piece of equipment, with a screen, used for watching programmes
- Pronunciation: /tiːviː/
- Syllables & Stress: **T**-V
- Example: We watch films on the TV.



type

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to press keys on a computer or phone to make words
- Pronunciation: /taɪp/
- Syllables & Stress: **type**
- Example: Please type your username in the box.



upload

- Word Type: verb
- Definition: to send files from your device to the internet
- Pronunciation: /ʌp'ləʊd/
- Syllables & Stress: up-**load**
- Example: I will upload a photo to the website.



video

- Word Type: noun
- Definition: an electronic recording of images, e.g. a TV programme, that can be watched
- Pronunciation: /ˈvɪdiəʊ/
- Syllables & Stress: **vid**-e-o
- Example: We watched a funny video.
