Comparative and Superlative Adjectives.

The comparative form is used to compare between two things or persons.

Example; Sam is older than Tom.

Rules of forming

comparatives:

- One or two syllable adjectives:
(Adjective + er) + than
My sister is taller than me.

- More than two syllable words
more + Adjective + than
The lion is more dangerous than the elephant.

The superlative form is used to compare between more than two things or persons.
For example; Sam is the tallest in the class.

Rules of forming

superlatives:

- One or two syllable adjectives:
the + (Adjective + est)
My sister is the tallest in the family.
- More than two syllable words
the + most + Adjective
The lion is the most dangerous.

Spelling Rules

- If the adjective ends with
consonant-vowel-consonant,
double the last letter.
The vowels are (u a e i o)
hot - hotter - hottest.
- If the adjective ends with (e), we add (r)/(st) only.
wide - wider - widest
- If the adjective ends with **consonant + (y)**
The (y) \longrightarrow i + (er)/(est)
tiny - tinier - tiniest
