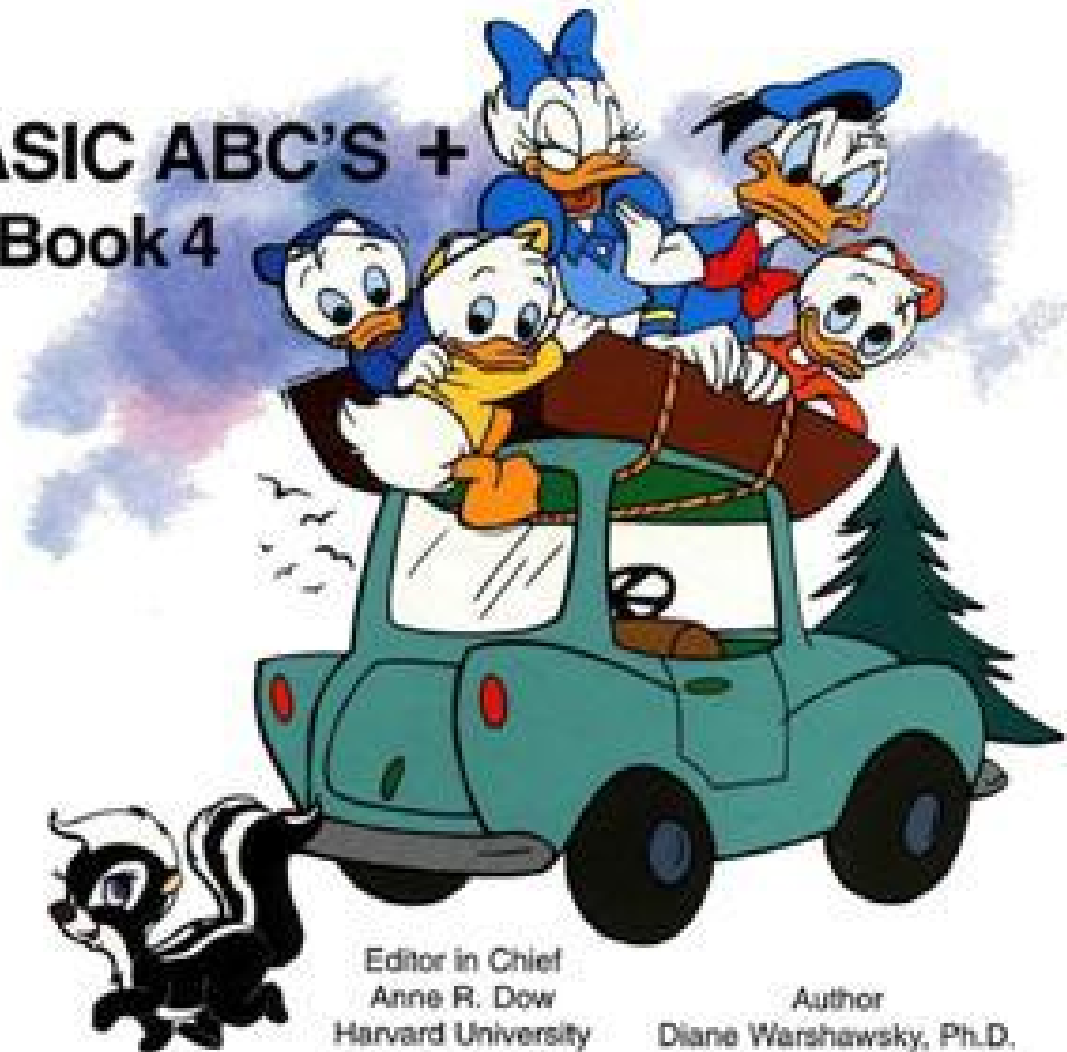



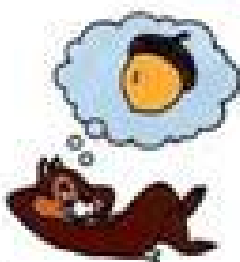

says Louie.



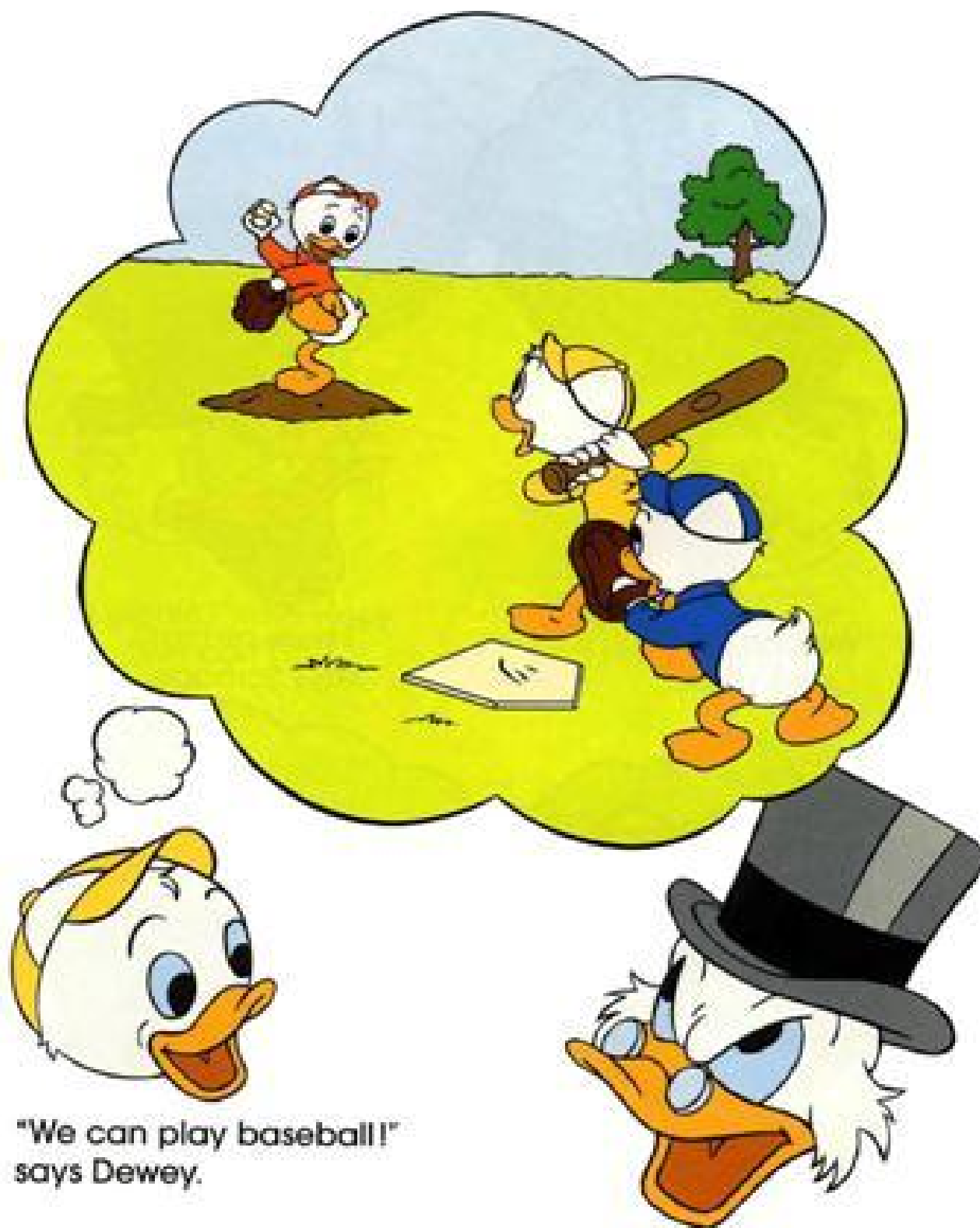
"I hate hiking!"

"We can build a fire!" says Huey.



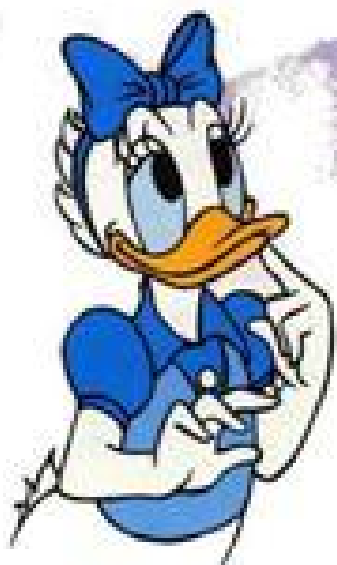
"I hate building fires!"

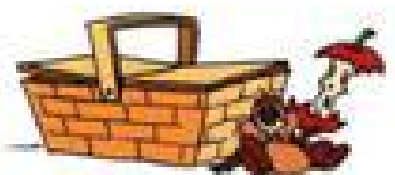


Minnie, Daisy, and Clarabelle are in the kitchen. They are very busy.

"Don't forget the matches!" says Daisy.



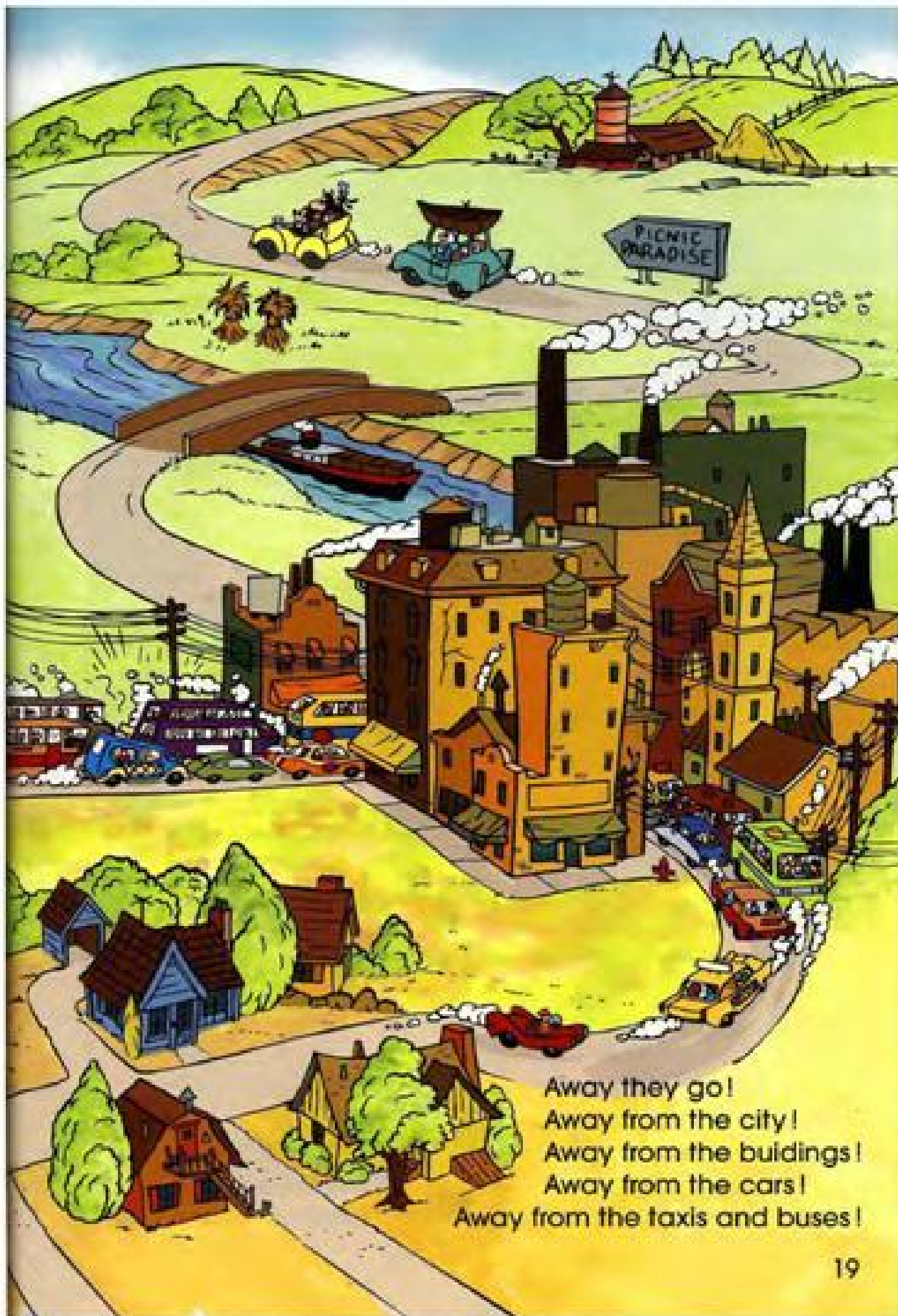


Mickey, Minnie, Goofy,

Mickey Mouse is short. Goofy is tall.

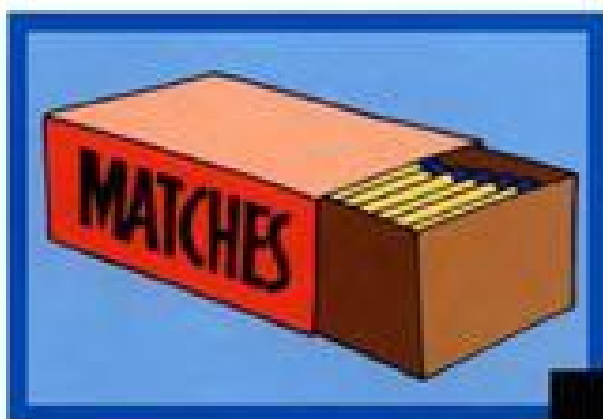

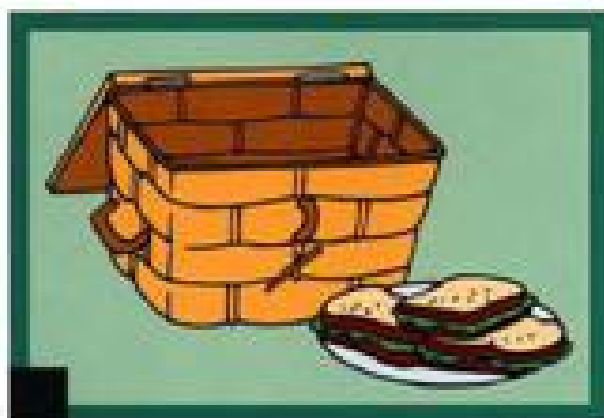

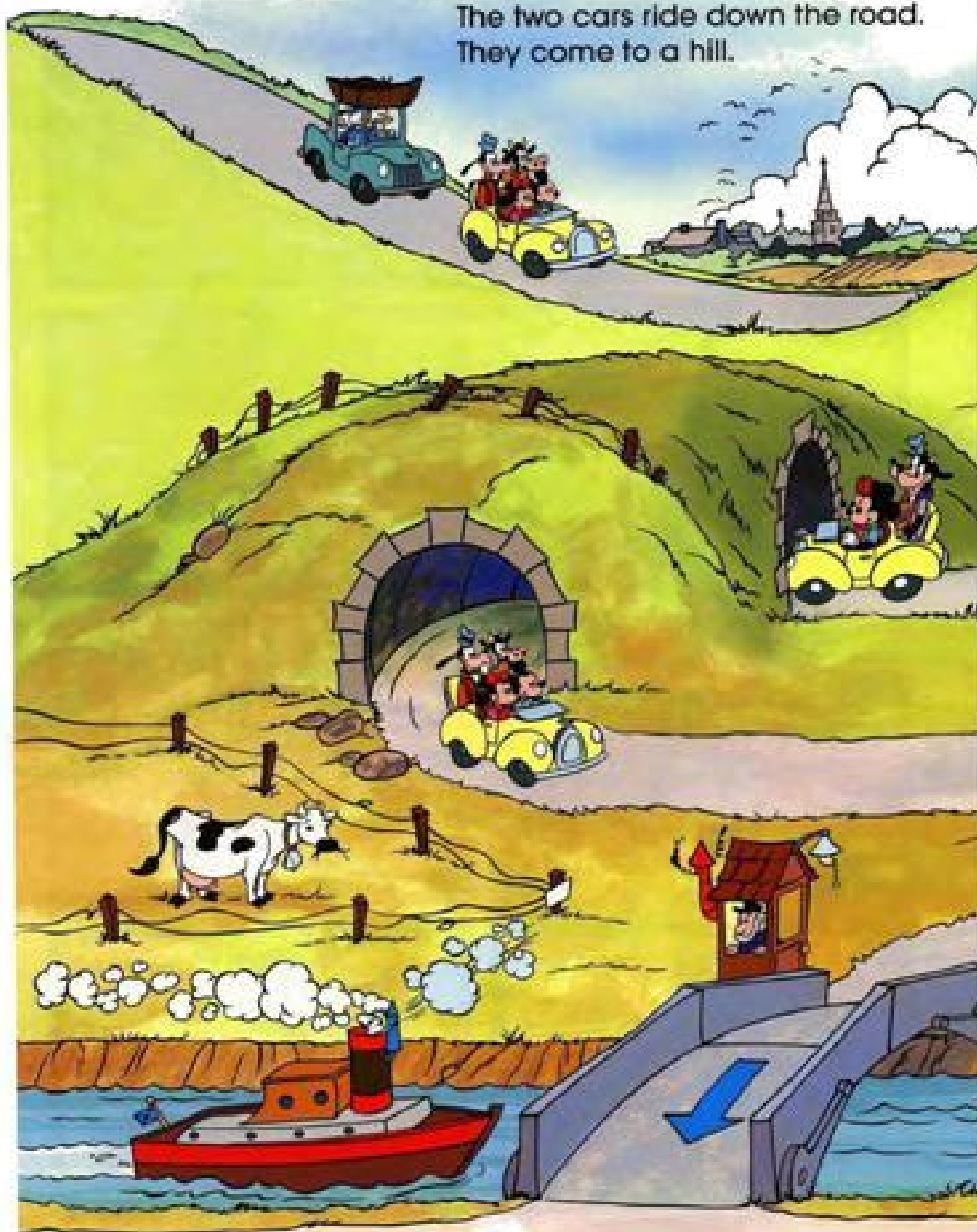

They come to a hill.



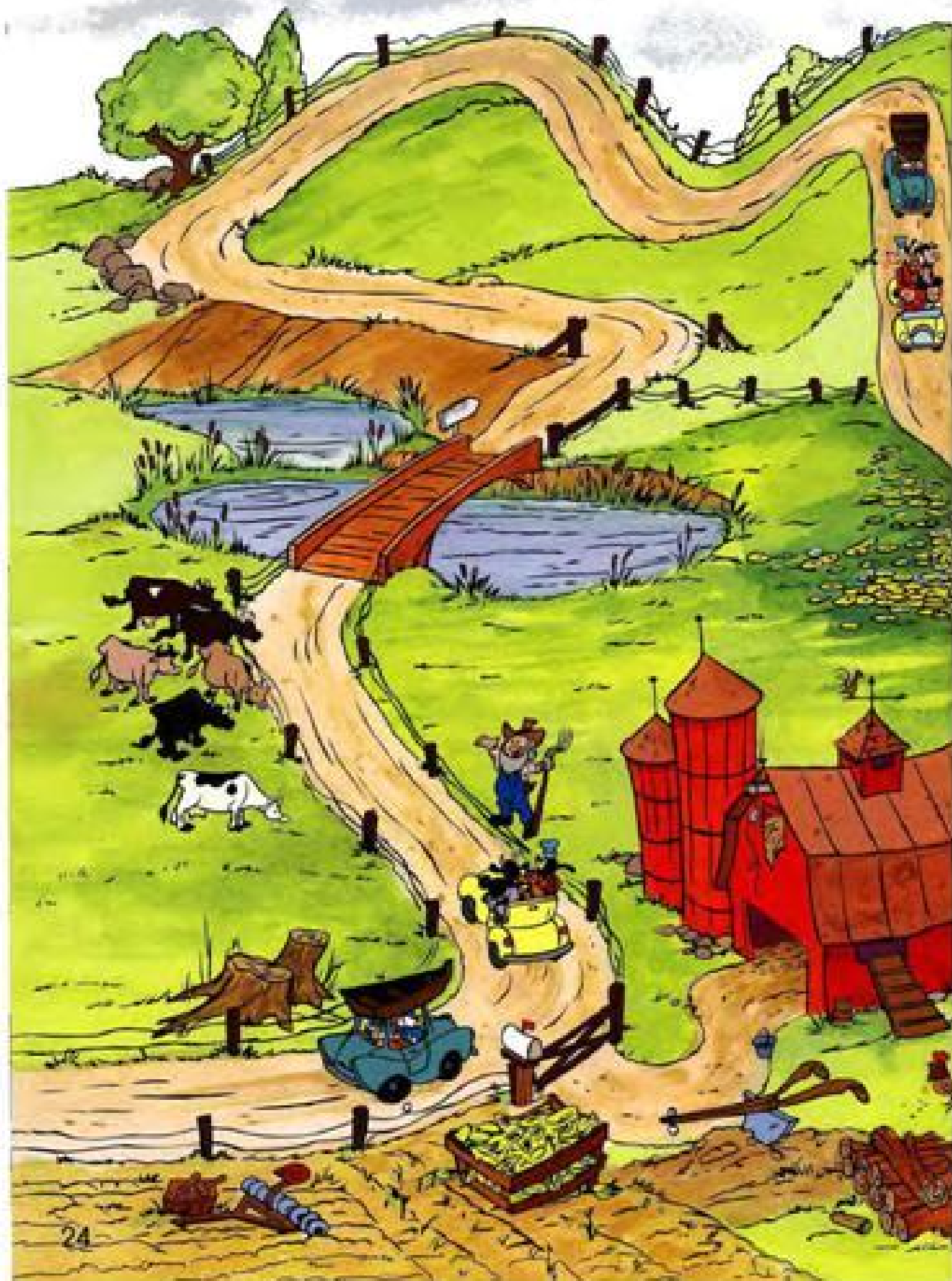


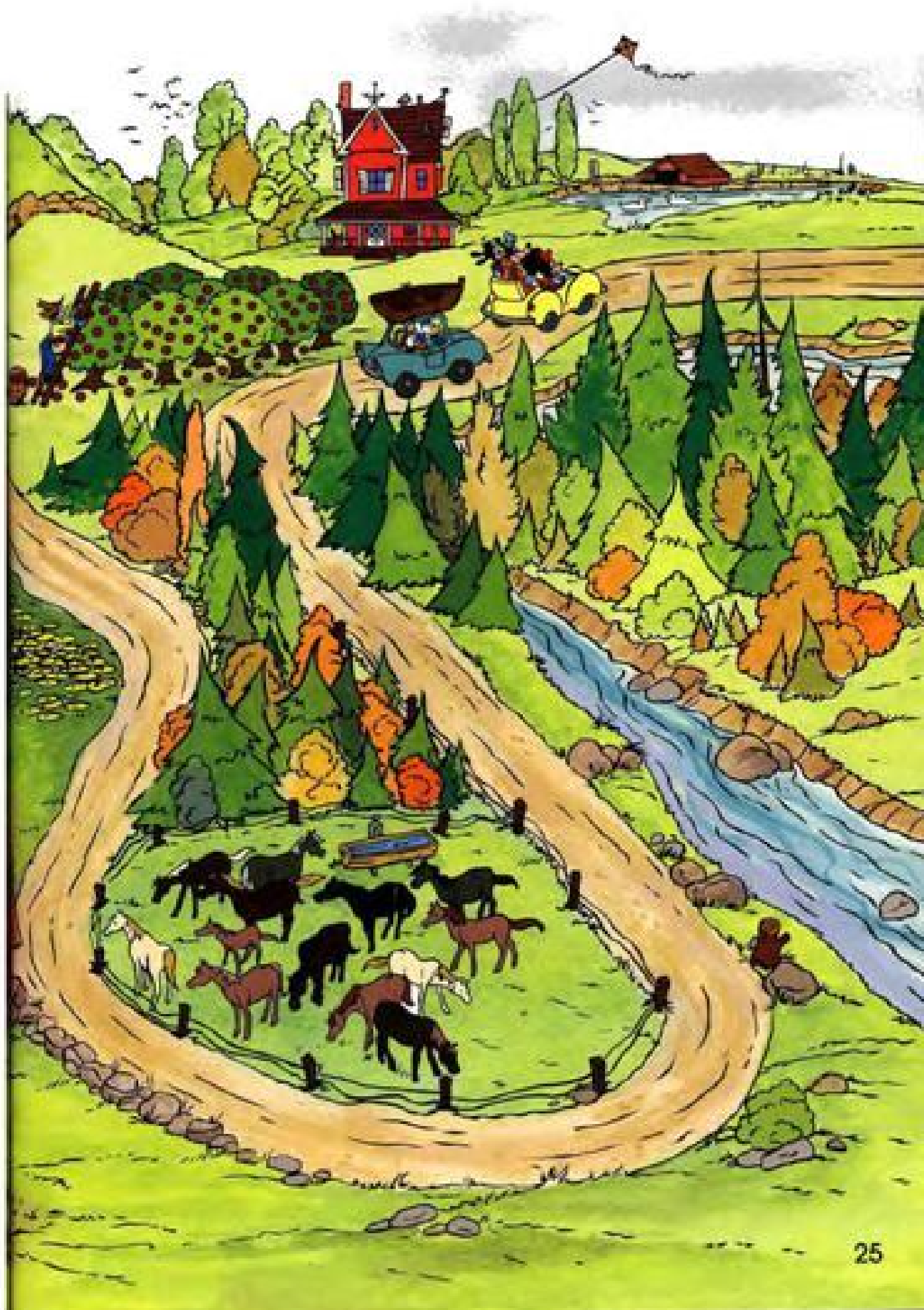
The two cars come to a tunnel.

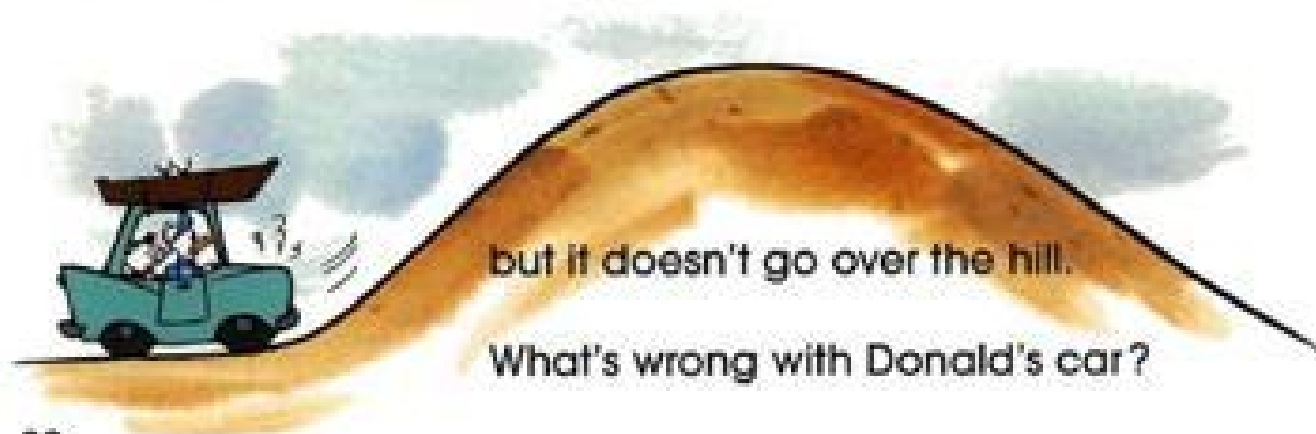
Mickey's car comes to a hill.



It goes over the hill.

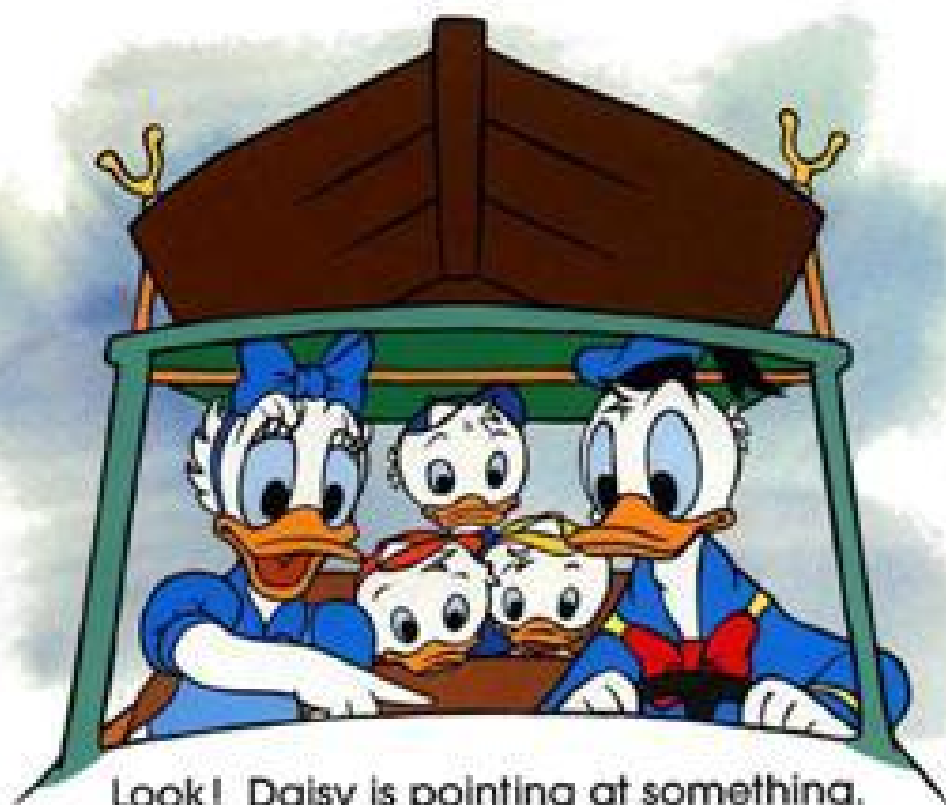


Donald's car comes to the same hill,

in Donald's car.



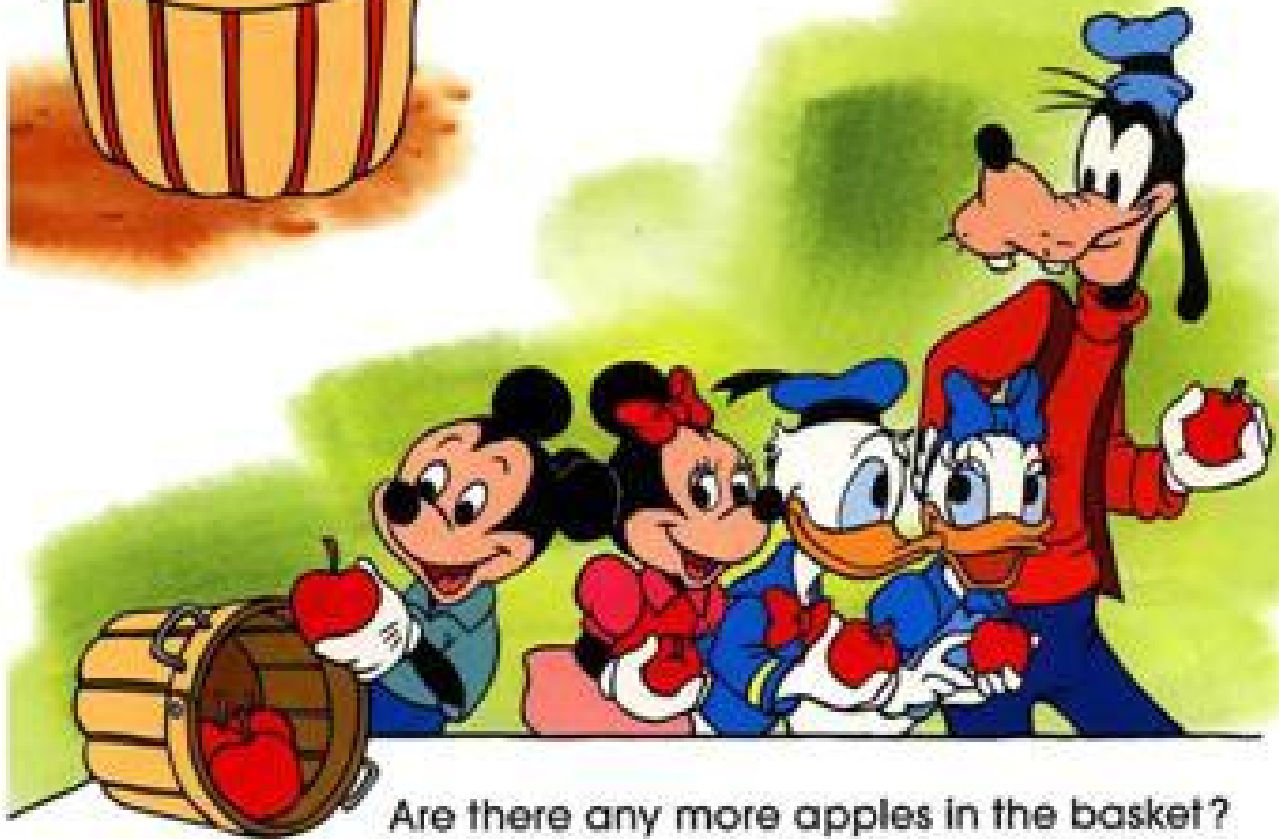
Donald pays

The basket is empty.



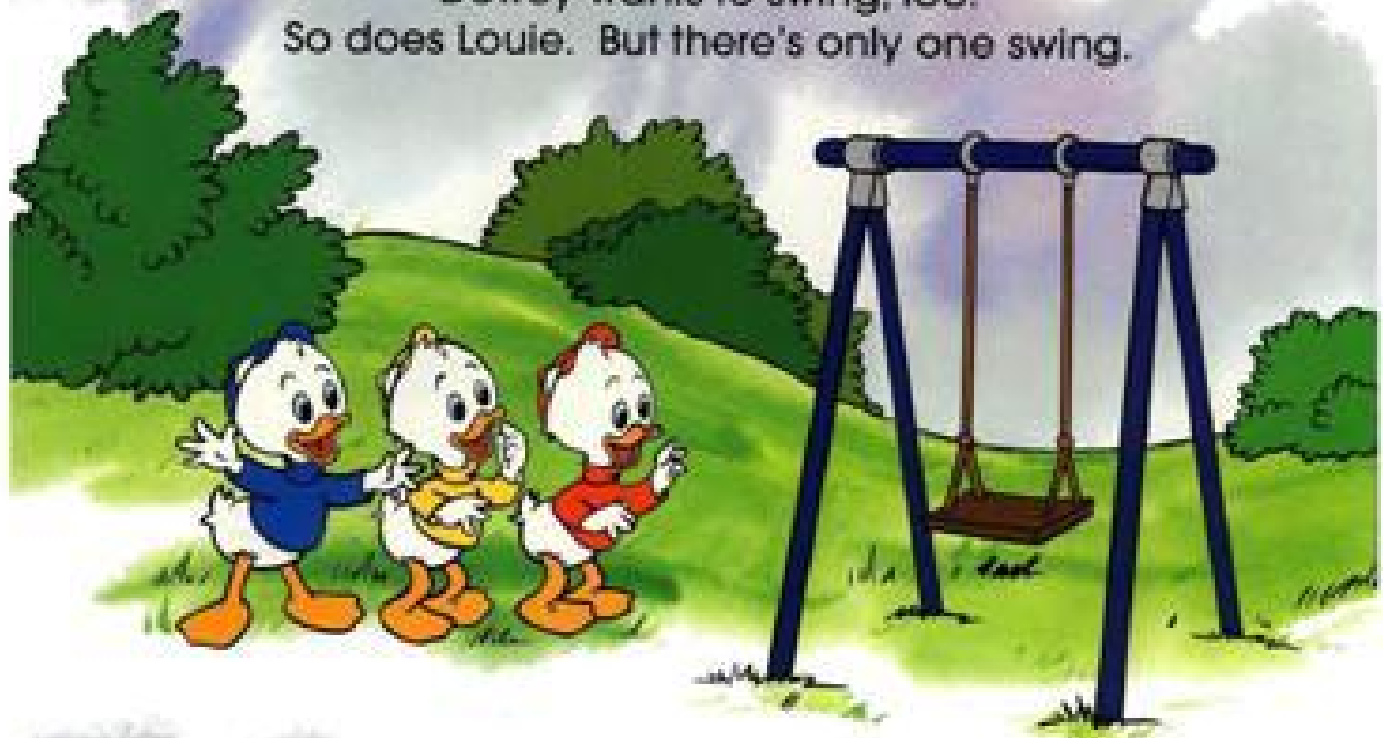
The bucket is full of water.

The bucket is empty.

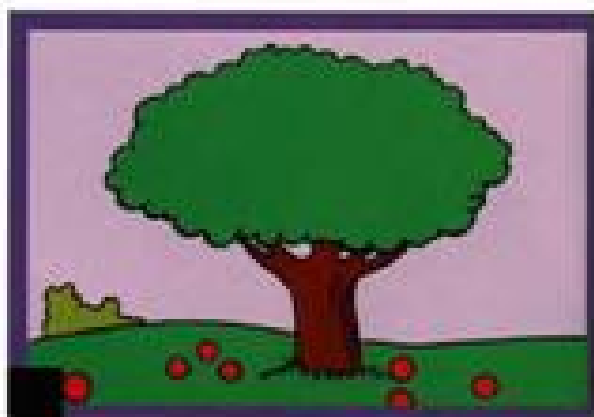
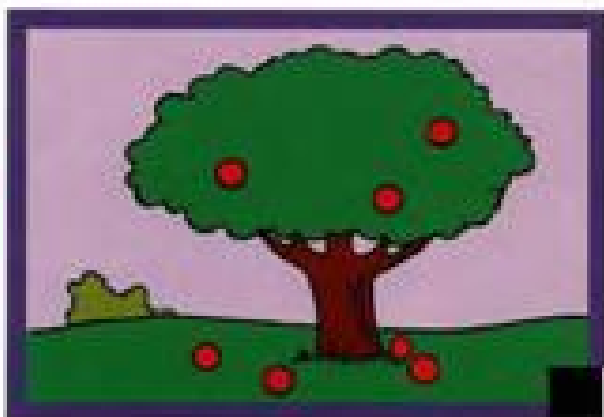
Look! A swing! Huey wants to swing.

Grandma is working very hard. Is Gus working hard, too?

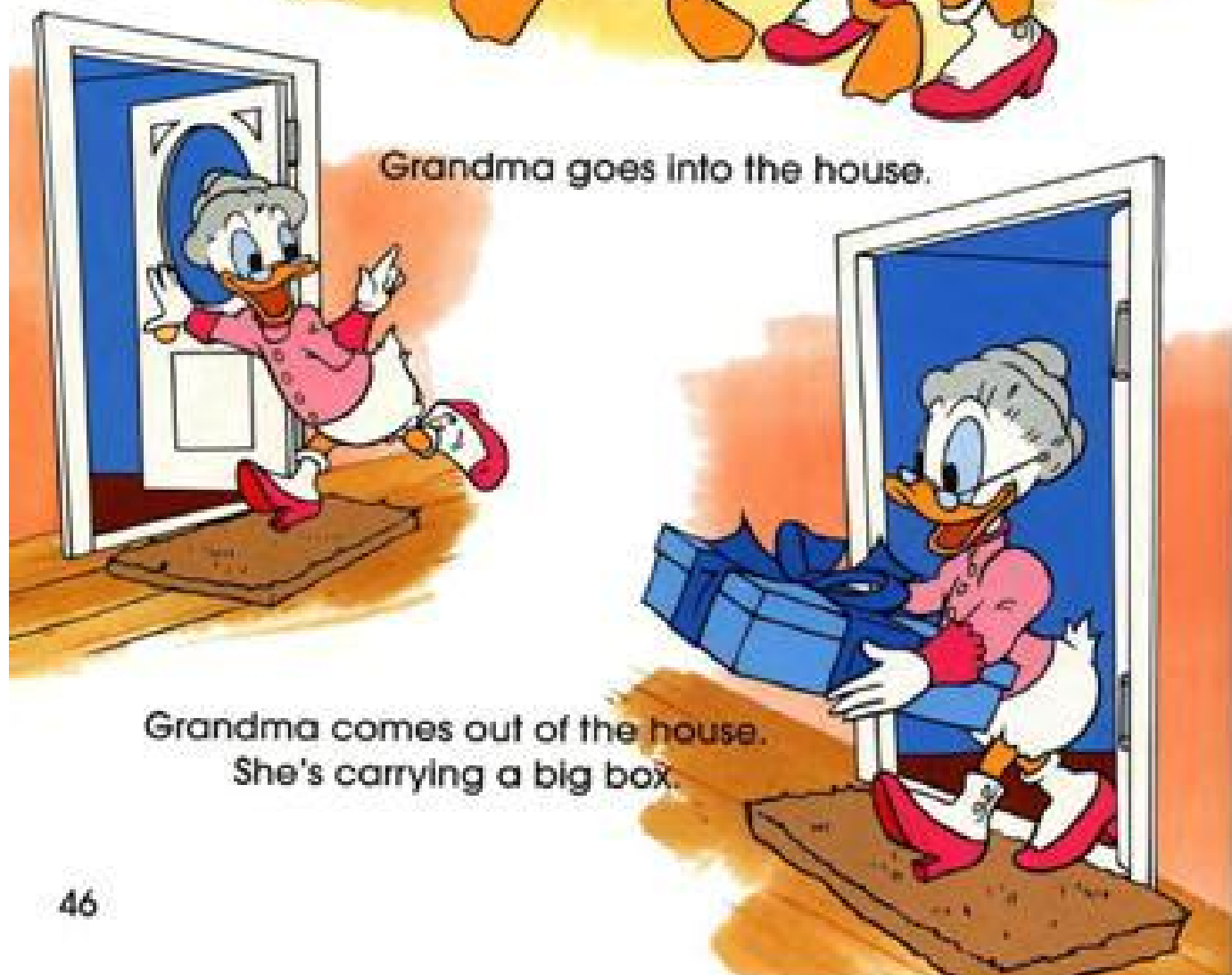


Grandma is at the well. She's getting water.

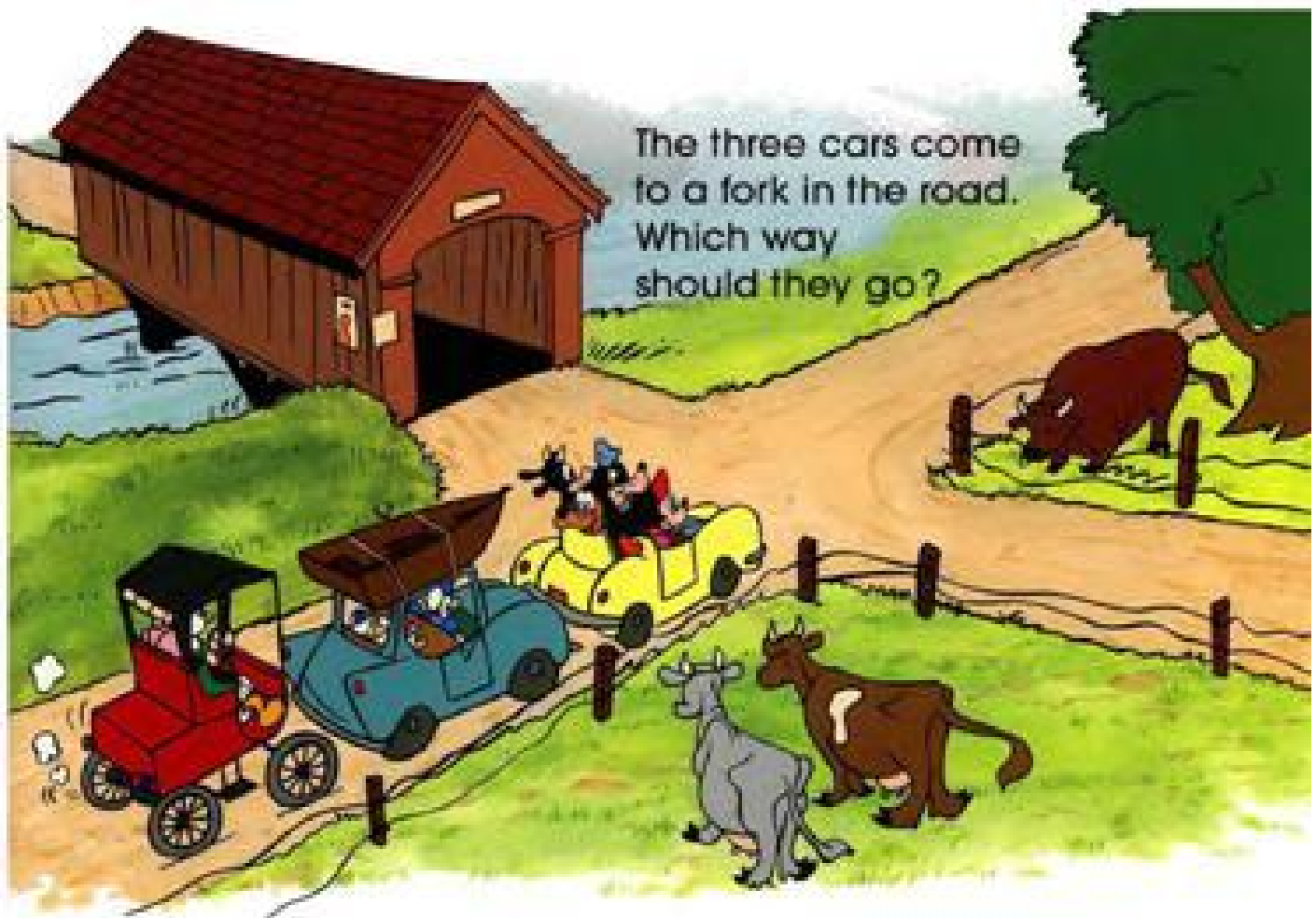

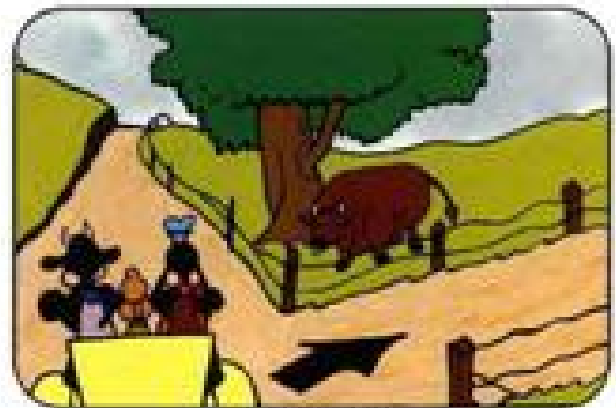

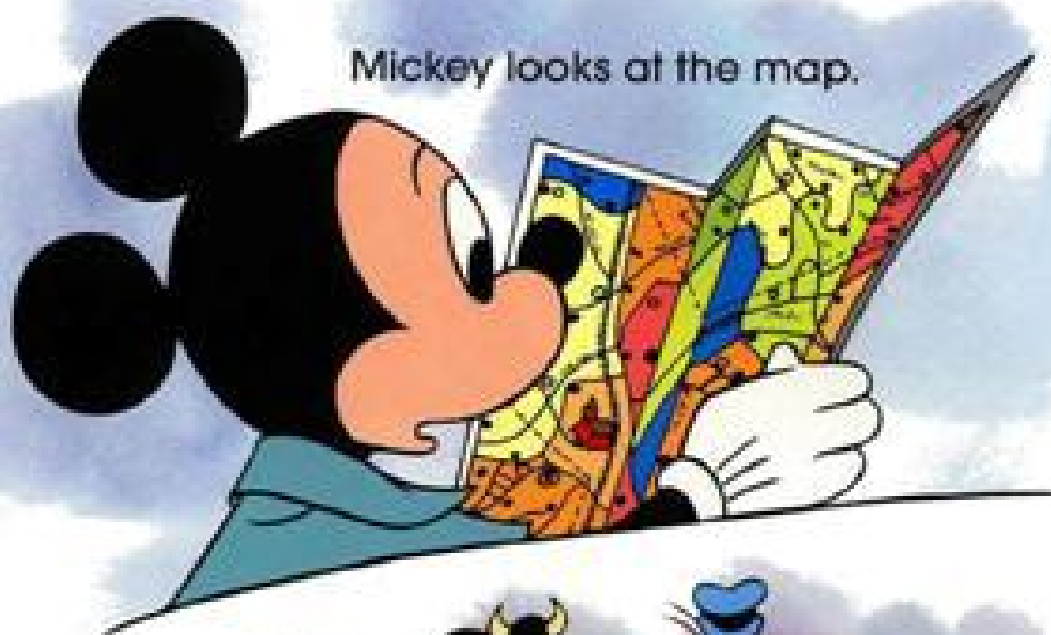

Mickey looks at the map.

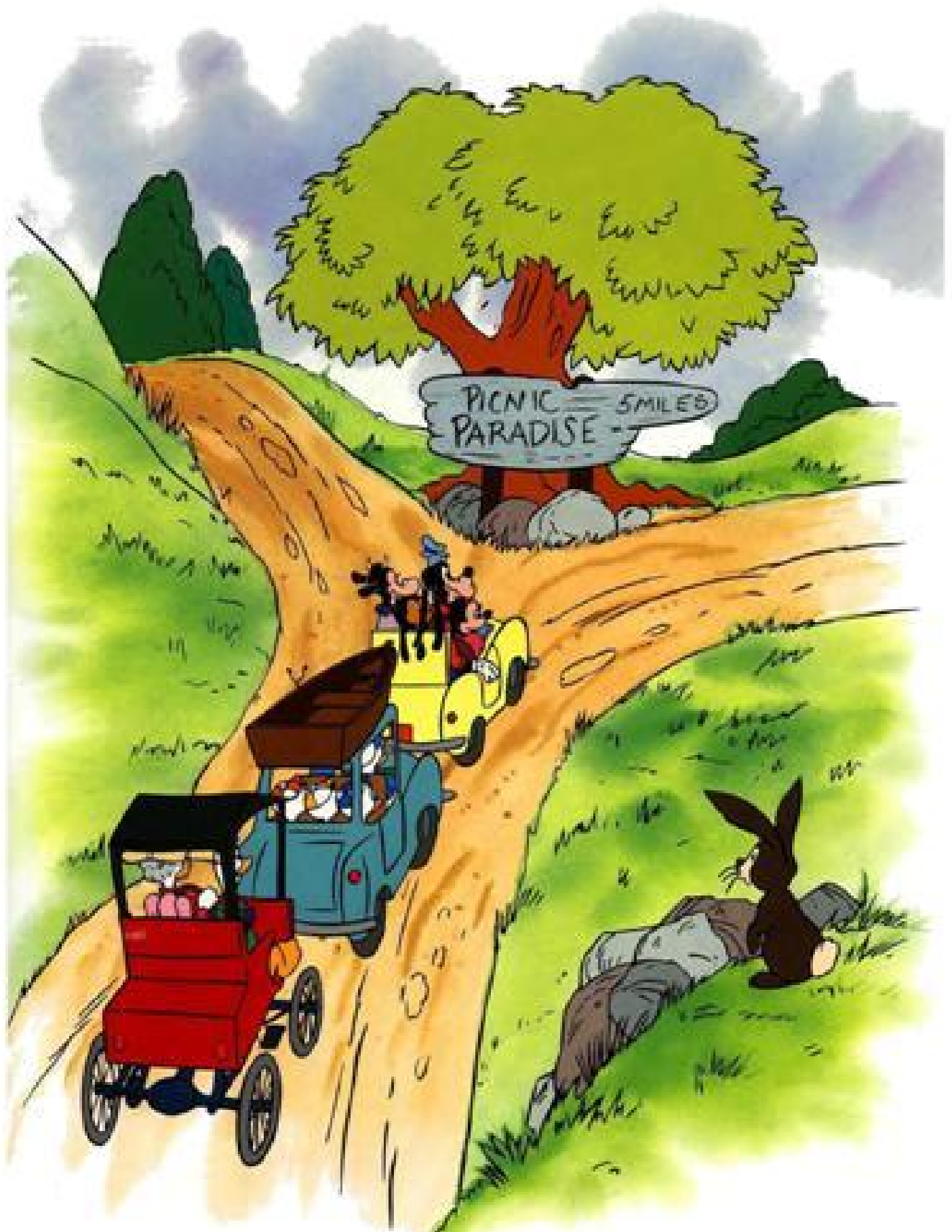
He looks out of the car and points to the left.

This way, everyone!

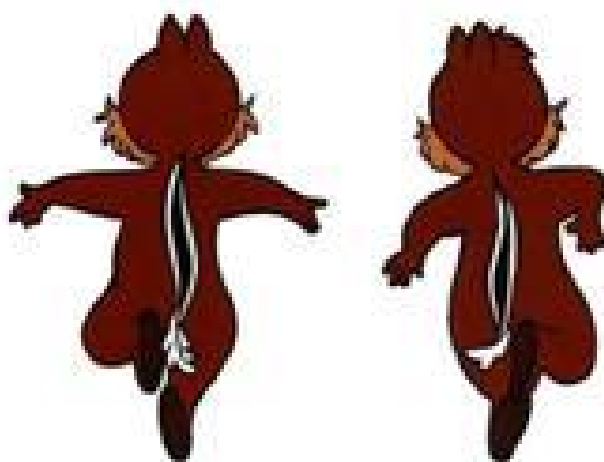


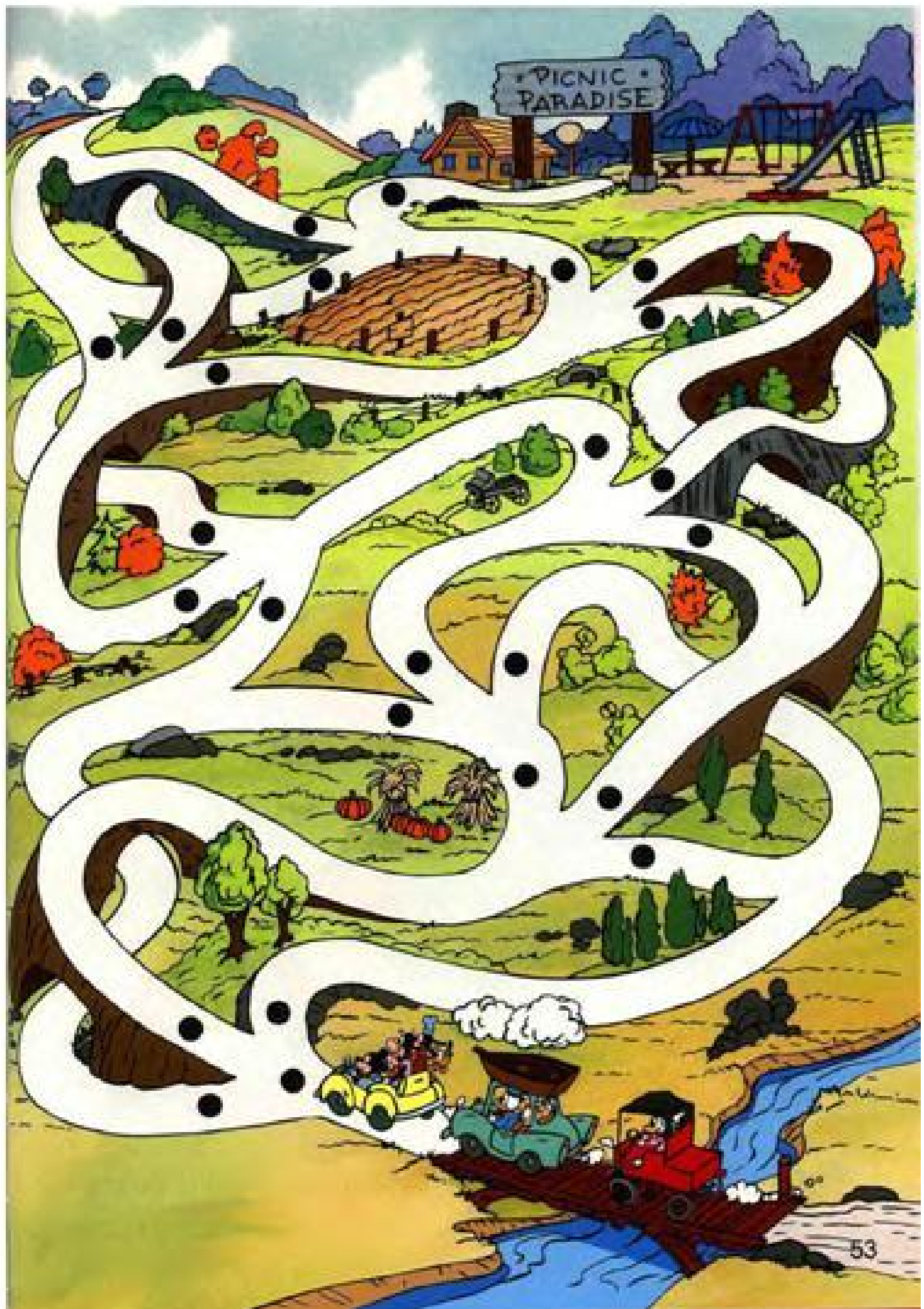
And the three cars turn left.
