It's coming down the track.



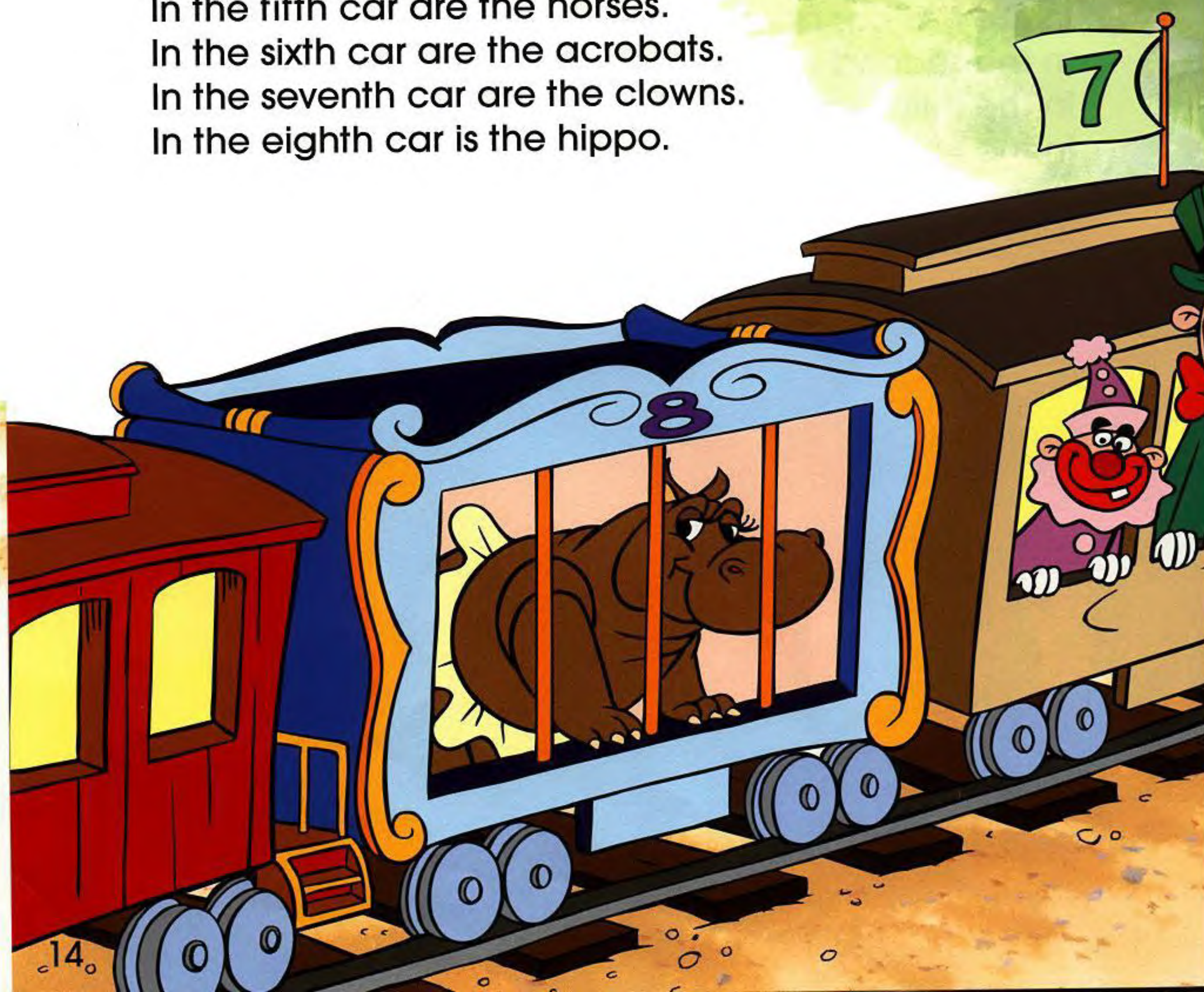
What's inside the circus train?

In the fourth car are the elephants.



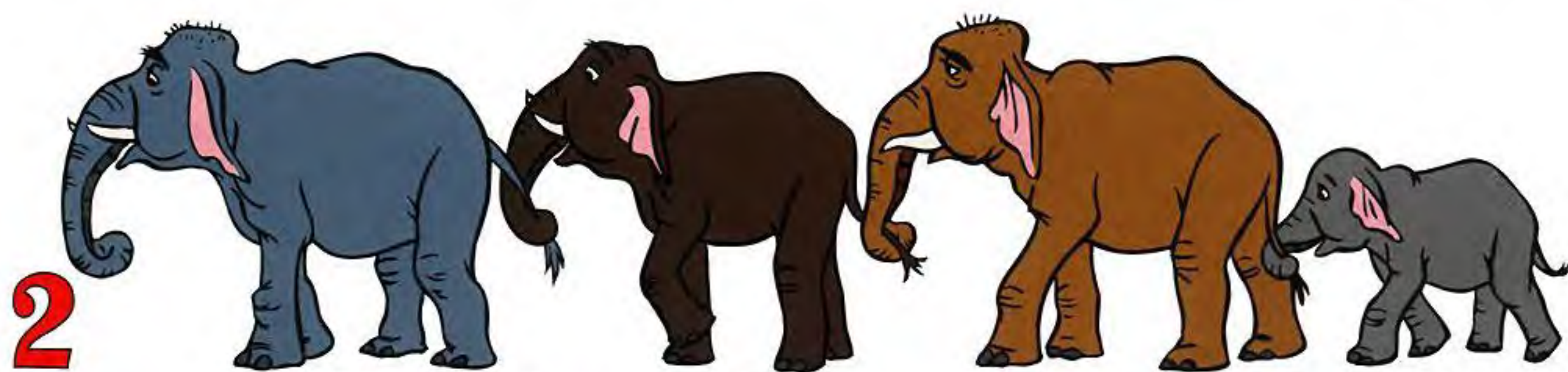
In the fifth car are the horses.

they think about all the circus animals eating dinner.



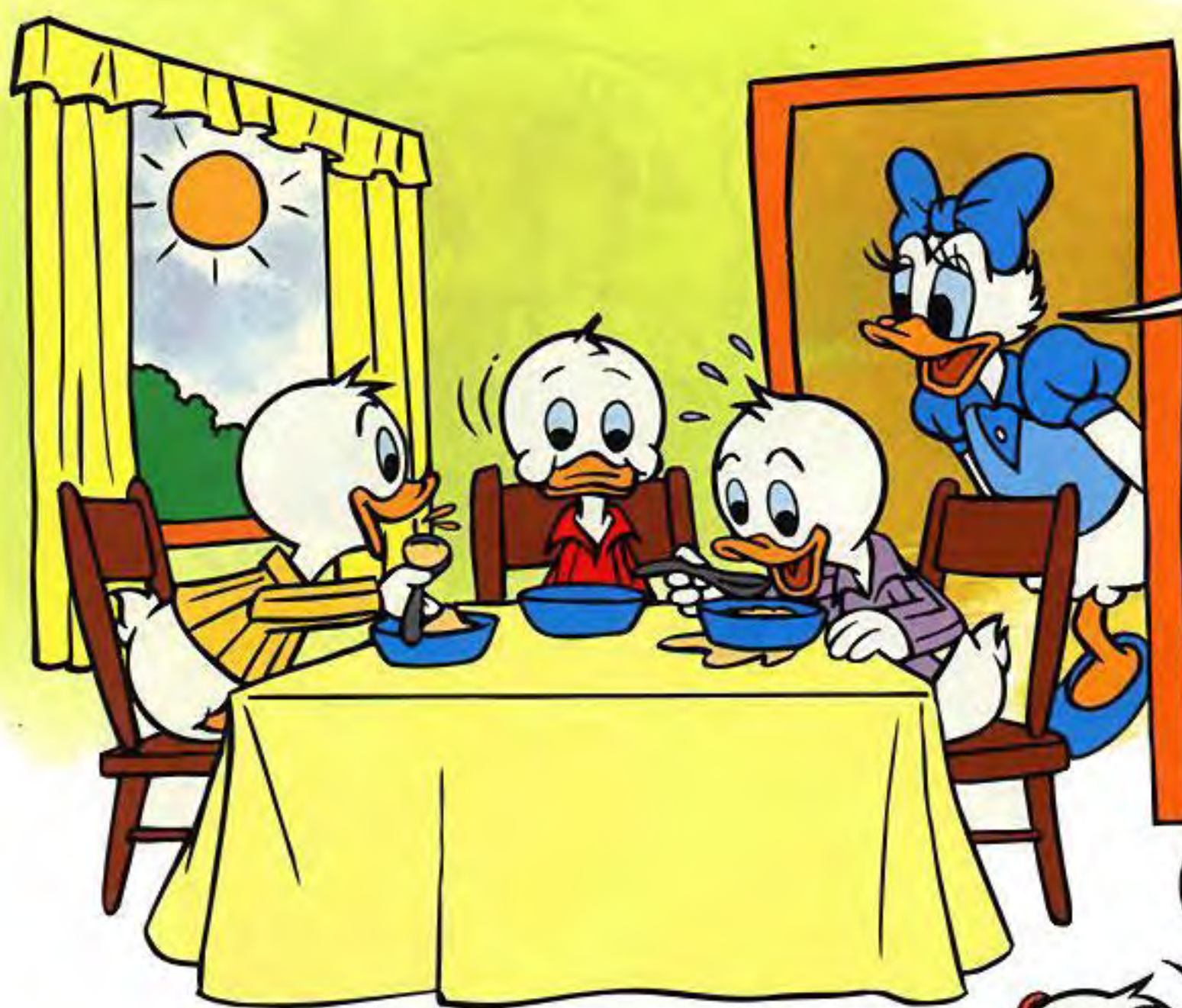
After dinner, they get ready for bed.

He lies in bed awake and thinks about the circus.

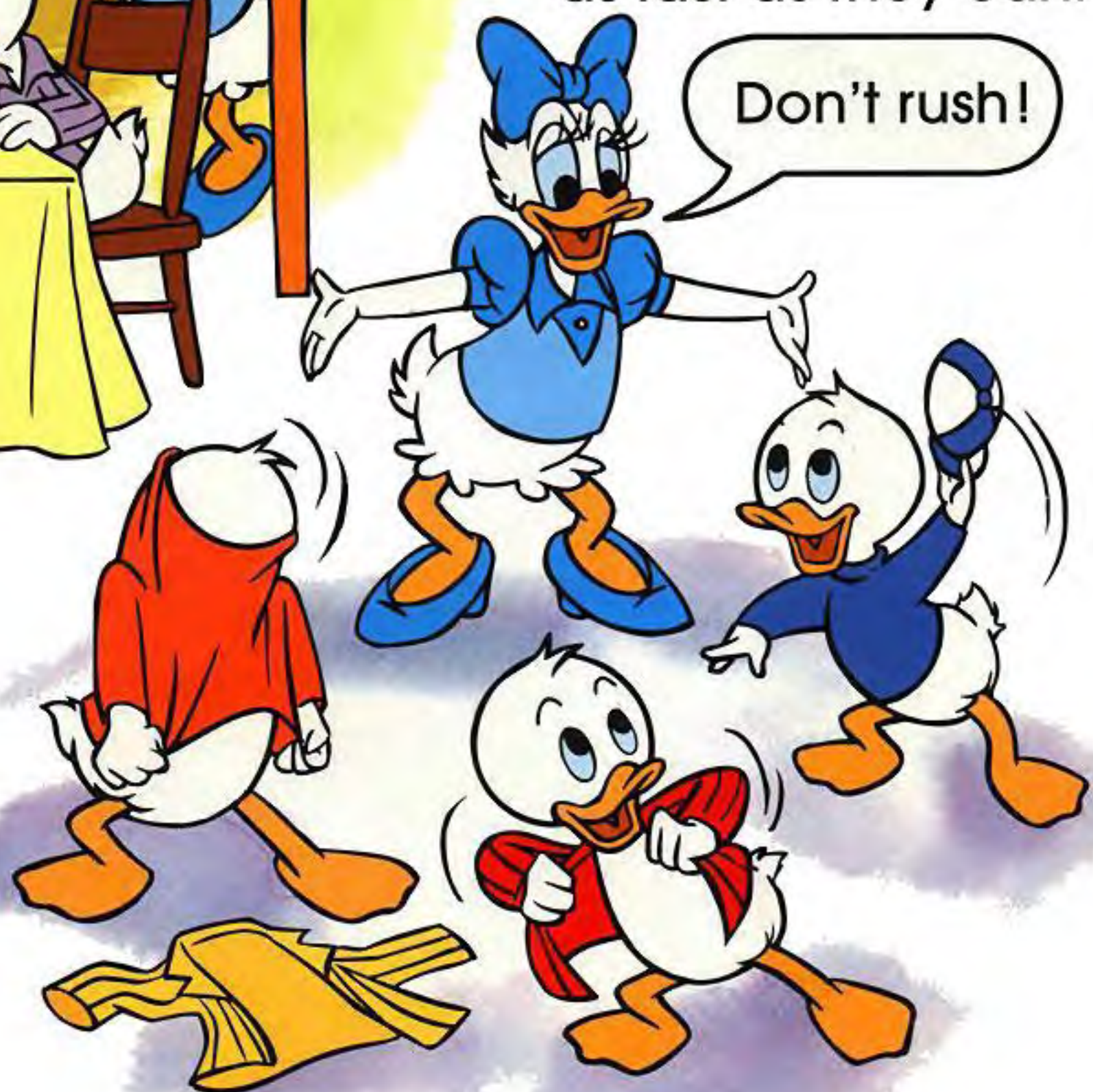
The next morning, Huey, Dewey, and Louie eat breakfast as fast as they can.



Don't eat so fast!

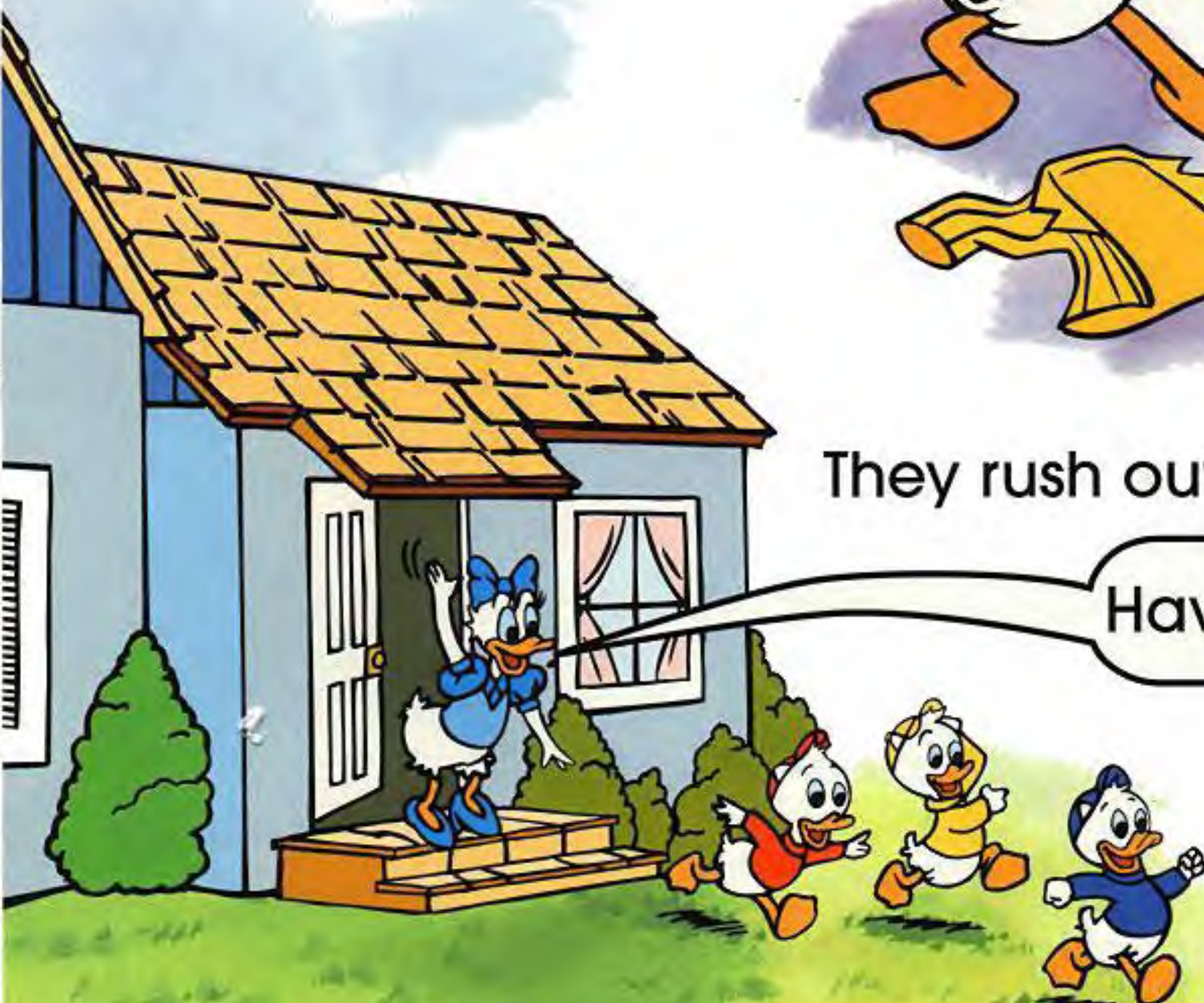
They put on their clothes as fast as they can.

Have a good time!



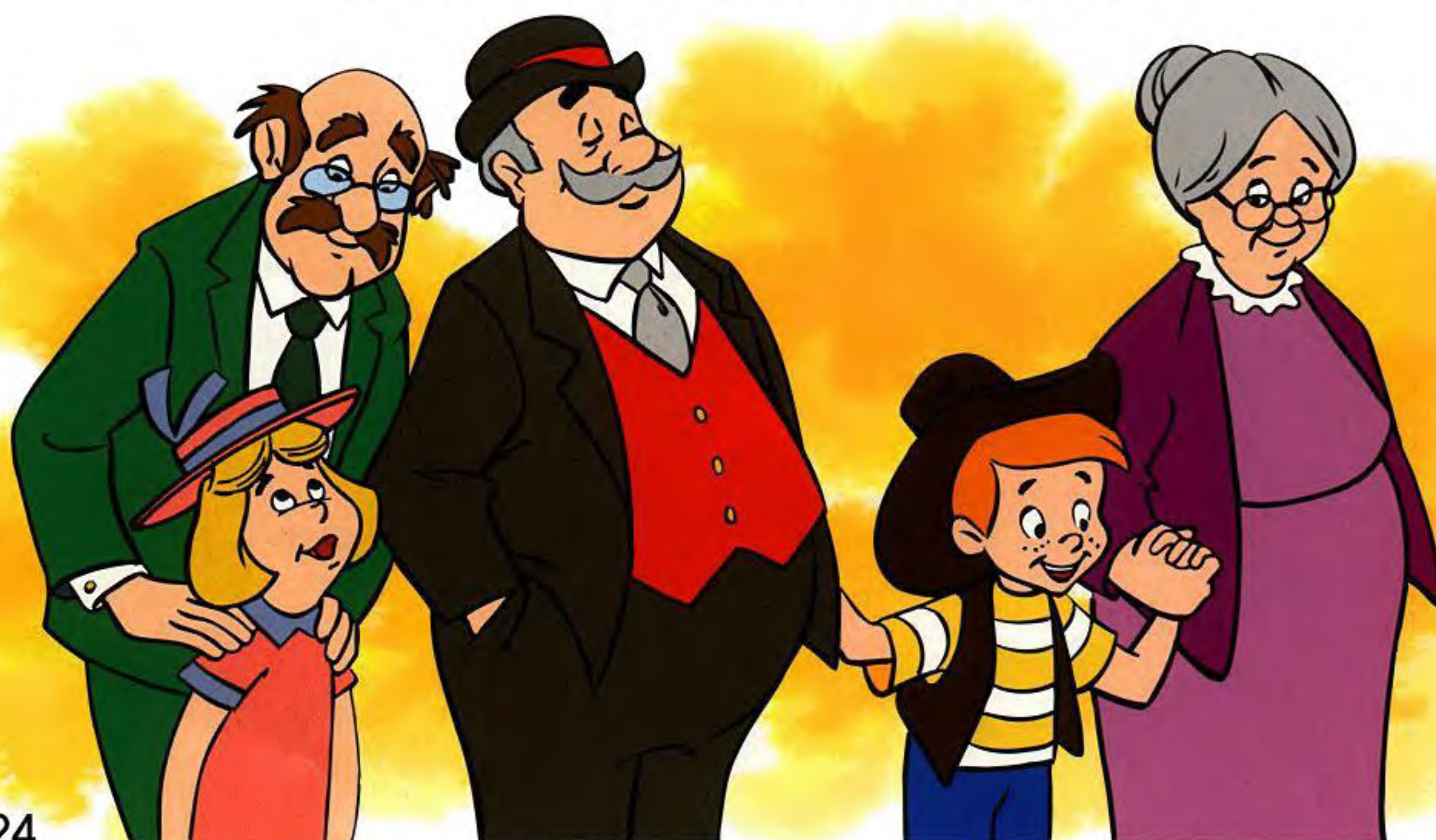
Look at all the people rushing down the street!

I'd like three tickets, please.

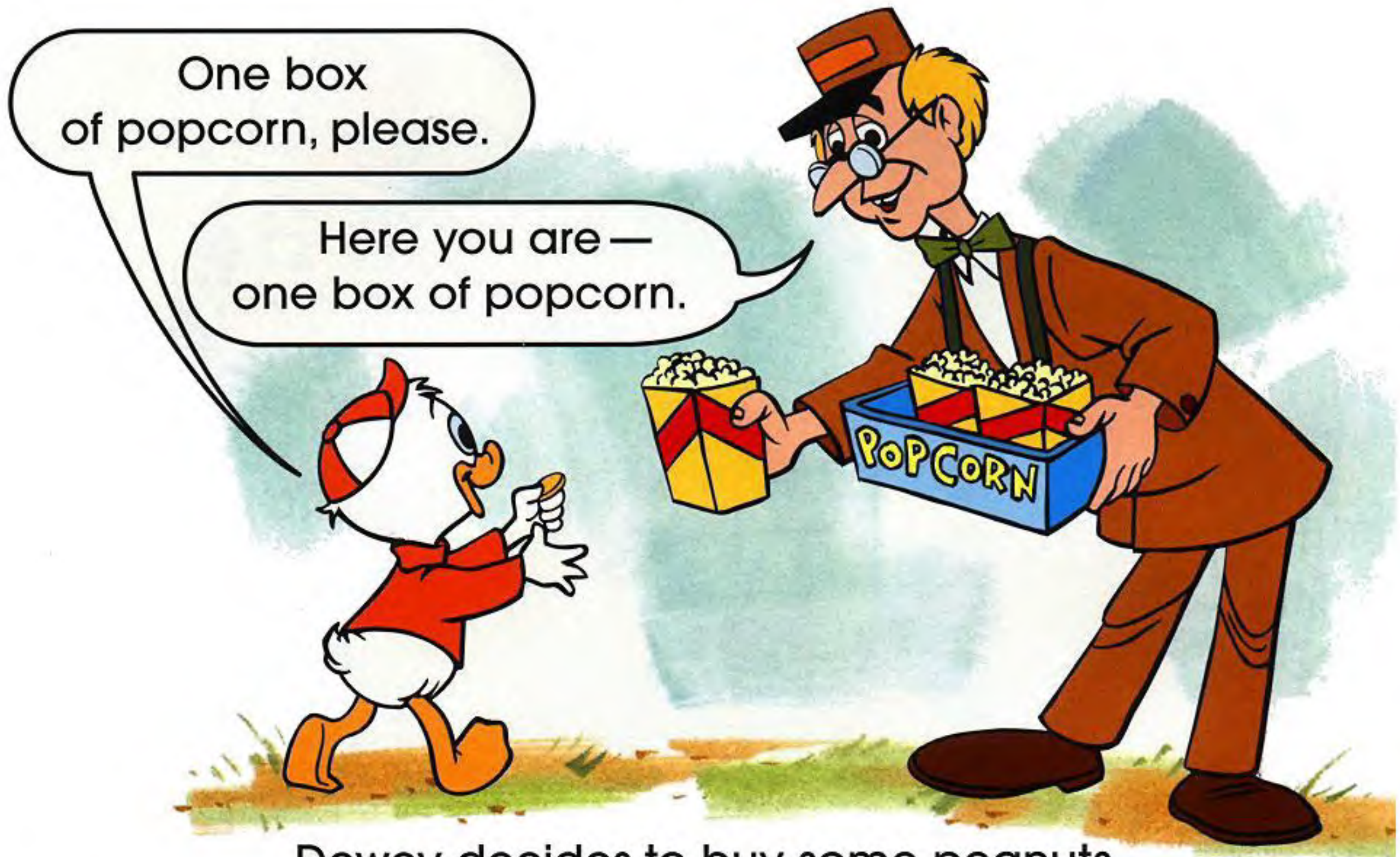


There are so many things to buy at the circus!

if I were you.

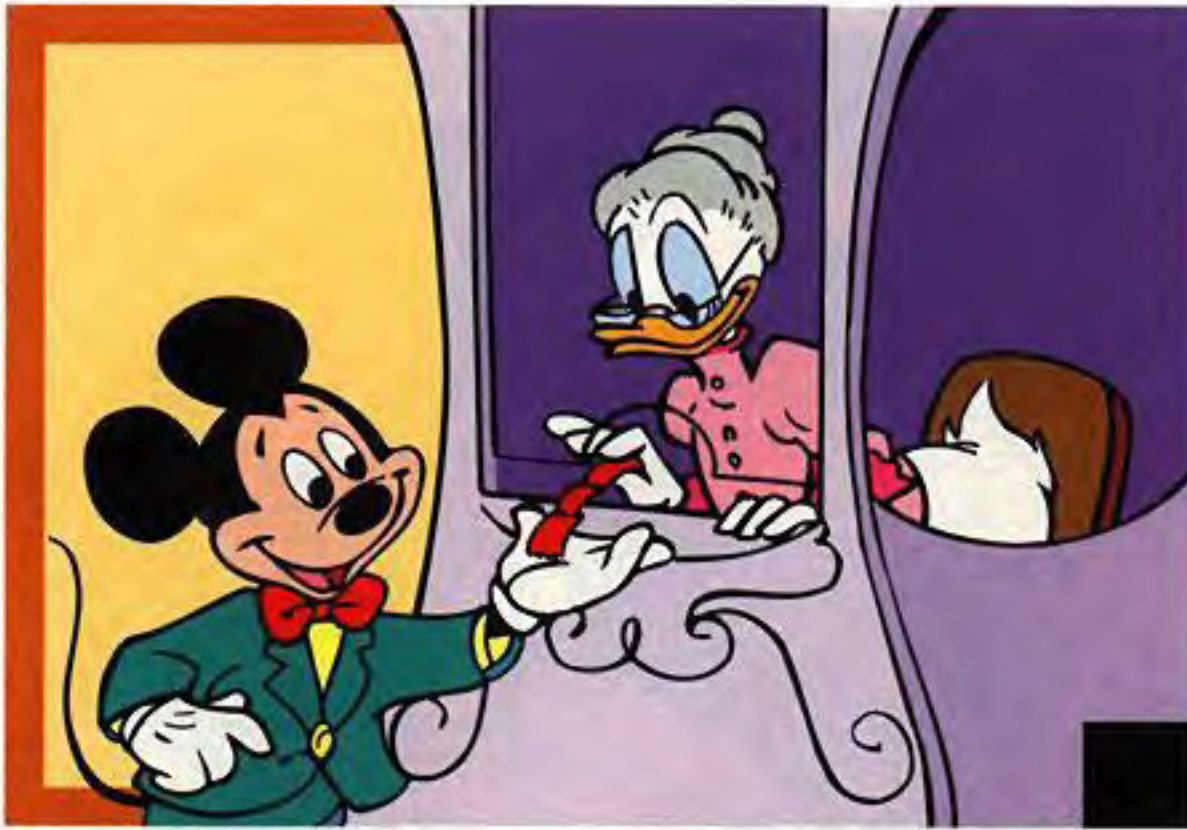
Finally, Louie decides. He buys a round balloon.

What's wrong with this picture?





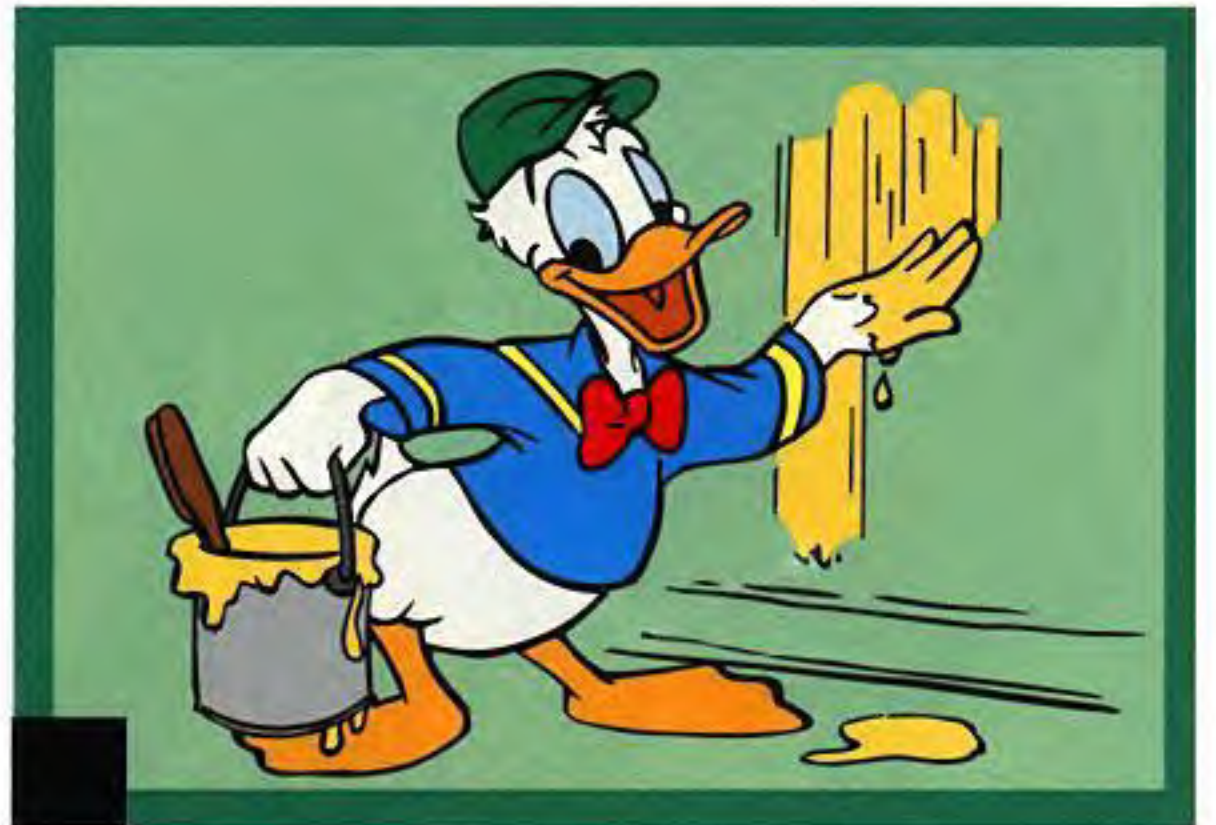

And then they dance some more!



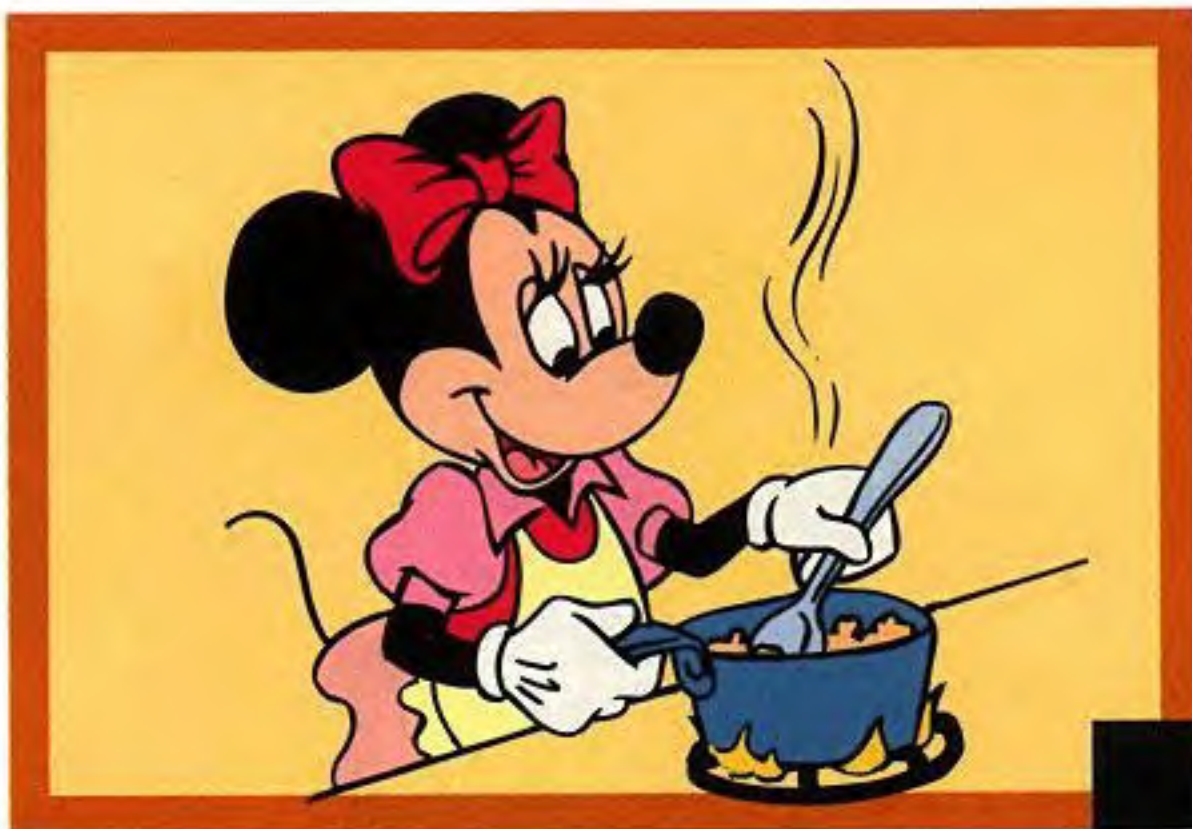
They turn together.

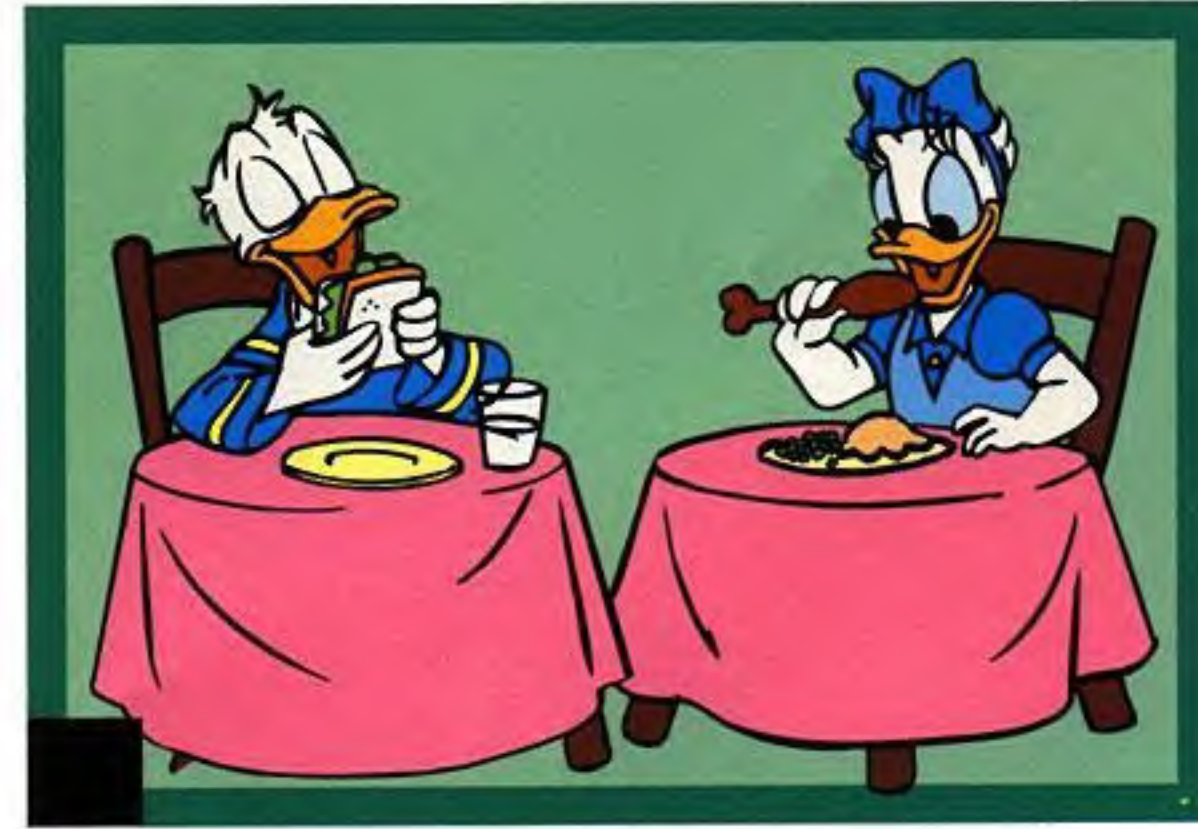
