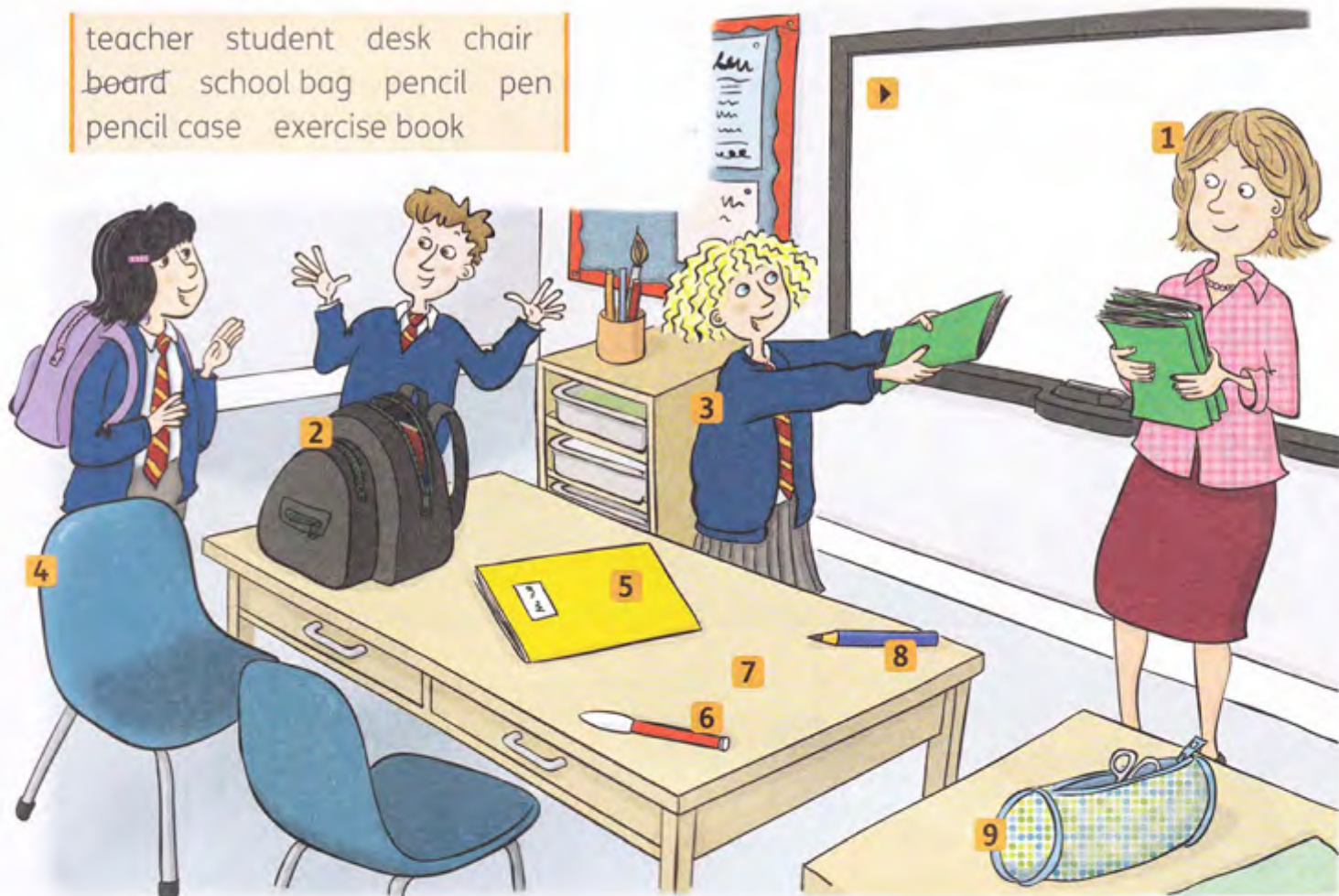

A person is **he** or **she**. A thing or a place is **it**. An animal is **it**. An animal with a name is **he** or **she**.

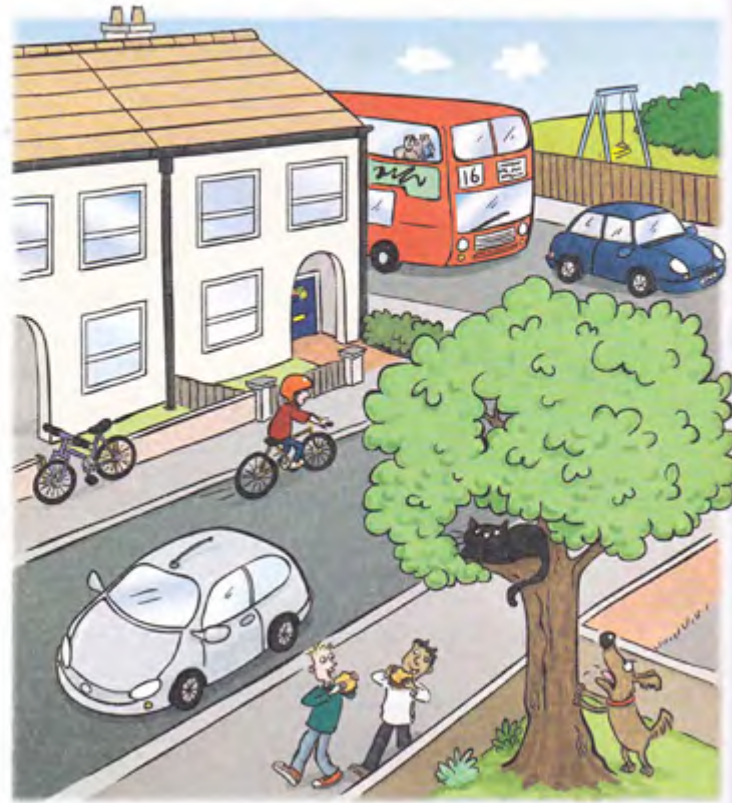

We use **the** when we talk about the same thing or person for the **second** time.

***The** big book's an English dictionary.*
