





Origami: Folding Paper for Fun

Most people have made a paper plane or boat at one time or another, but the art of folding paper started in ancient times.

Origami is a form of art that includes making various designs, like animals or flowers, from paper. The word origami comes from two Japanese words: 'ori', which means fold, and 'kami', which means paper. One of the most common and famous origami designs is the crane, which is a water bird with a long neck and long legs. The crane symbolises peace and some people believe that anyone who makes 1,000 cranes is going to get his or her biggest wish come true. Apart from being a creative form of art, the study of origami is also interesting for those who enjoy Maths.


