Examples:

Turtles are slow. Turtles walk slowly.





Prepositions of place

These words tell us where things are.



Examples:

The ball is in the box.

The ball is under the table.

Connecting words: and, but

These words join words and sentences.

We use and to join wo words or sentences.

We use but to say something different or surprising.

Examples:

Omar likes apples and bananas.

I like apples, **but** I don't like bananas.
