Triceratops is one of the most famous dinosaurs. It lived about sixty-eight thousand ⁽¹⁾ years ago. It had two ⁽²⁾ horns on its face. One horn was on its nose and two larger horns were above the eyes.

Triceratops was about eighteen ⁽³⁾ metres tall and was nearly 10 metres long. It wasn't as tall or as big as a T-rex, but it was very big and weighed about 10 000 kilos. From studying fossils, people ⁽⁴⁾ know that Triceratops had four arms ⁽⁵⁾ and its feet were a metre wide.

Triceratops ate plants and berries ⁽⁶⁾ and was able to pull down leaves from trees with its horns. Triceratops could lay twelve ⁽⁷⁾ eggs and covered them with plants to keep them warm. Babies hatched from eggs that were the size of a berry ⁽⁸⁾!




