The Team of Authors of the Islamic Education curriculum is pleased to present to our dear students the Islamic Education textbook in its new form, praying to Allah, Exalted be He, that it will help them increase their knowledge, expand their perceptions, and elevate their morals; He is the All-Hearer, the All-Answerer.

In constructing the book, the unit-based approach has been adopted. 



Allah تَعَالَى tells His Messenger ﷺ that He revealed the Holy Qur'an on a great, blessed night, one of the nights of the holy month of Ramadan; it is the Night of Qadr (Glory and Power). On this night, Allah تَعَالَى forgives sins, sends down mercy and blessing, answers prayers and multiplies the reward of good deeds.

On this night, angels and Gabriel ﷺ descend. It is a night of

peace and reassurance. It from sunset to dawn.

The Night of Qadr (Glory) is the greatest night of Ramadan. It is the night on which Allah ﷺ ordered Gabriel ﷺ to reveal the Holy Qur'an from the al-Lawh al-Mahfooz (the Preserved Tablet). It is a night in which good deeds are better than the good deeds of a thousand months. It is in one of the odd nights of the last ten days of Ramadan: (21 / 23 / 25 / 27 / 29 of the month of Ramadan).



Once Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was praying in Kaabah, and was in prostration to ALLAH, Uqbah ibn Mu'ayt, one of the Quryashi disbelievers, came to him and put tripe (stomach) full of compost (waste) of the camel on holy prophet's back. The Prophet did not raise his head from prostration. When Fatima ؓ heard this news she came running, advanced bravely and removed the waste from prophet's back.





Prophet Muhammad ﷺ said to them, "Shall I tell you the thing which is much better than a servant? When going to bed, say ALLAHU AKBAR 33 times, SUBHAN ALLAH 33 times, and ALHAMDU LILLAH 33 times. This is better for you than having a servant." (Al-Bukhari)

Islam is the religion of morals. It has ordered us to respect the feelings of others, honor them and not hurt them or make them sad. Respecting others requires that two persons should not talk secretly in the presence of a third person. Islam has prohibited this because it hurts the feeling of the third person. He may be sad and feel that he is not important in their sight. He may even think that they are speaking badly about him. This may lead to hatred and division between them, while Islam wants Muslims to love one another and be strong and united.







He has Al-Kawthar River in Paradise; he will give us a drink from that river after which we will never be thirsty.

The grandfather sat happy with his two little grandchildren, Salim and Majid, who passed their examinations with honors.

Father: I see, father, that you take care of my sons and make them very happy.

Grandfather: Yes, as I made you happy before them, my son.

Father: I have learned a lot from you. You have taught me how to be kind to you and to my family, how to bring up my children well, and to always visit my uncles and aunts. May Allah give you good health and bless you in your life!

Grandfather: I follow the example of our gracious Prophet, Muhammad ﷺ.

Father: Our blessed Prophet, Muhammad ﷺ loved his children and grandchildren and treated them with matchless compassion and kindness.

in her house. She also used to visit him, and when she left he said goodbye to her gently.

Salim: I read in the Biography of the Prophet ﷺ that he was the most loving and merciful toward his grandchildren. Al-Hassan and Al-Hussain ﷺ rode his back and he moved with them around the house.

Majid: He loved his granddaughter, Umamah bint Abil-Aas as much as he loved his two grandsons, AL-Hassan and Al-Hussain ﷺ. He was frequently seen leaving his house and carrying Umamah on his shoulder. He used to carry her while he was praying: when he bowed, he put her down on the floor, and when he stood up he lifted her.

Grandfather: The Prophet ﷺ treated his wives kindly. At home, he was at the service of his family; and when it was prayer time, he went out for prayer. He ﷺ sewed his dress and mended his stockings; he did what men did in their houses.

Salim: An example of his kindness ﷺ to his relatives was his kindness to his uncles, Al-Abbas ibn Abd Al-Muttalib and Hamza ibn Abd Al-Muttalib ﷺ.

Majid: The Prophet ﷺ embraced and reared his cousin, Ali ibn Abi Talib, and when he grew up he married his most beloved daughter, Fatimah Az-Zahraa, off to him.


In the year of conquering Makkah, Abu Quhafa asked his daughter to take him to Abu Bakr As-Siddeeq رض. She took him there, for he had lost his eyesight. When the Prophet صلی اللہ علیہ وسَلَّمَ entered the mosque, Abu Bakr went out and returned leading his father. When the Prophet صلی اللہ علیہ وسَلَّمَ saw him coming, he told Abu Bakr that his father was an old man; he should have remained at home and the Prophet could have gone to him in respect for his age; then he invited him to become Muslim.

The Prophet ﷺ said, "The father is the middle door of Paradise (i.e. the best way to Paradise), so it is up to you whether you take advantage of it or not." (Tirmithi)



The Prophet ﷺ said, "He is not one of us who does not show mercy to our young ones and esteem our elders." (Tirmithi)

Ali رضي الله عنه said that the Prophet ﷺ said, "A miser is the one who hears my name but he does not pray upon me." (Tirmithi)

Some virtues of the Prophet ﷺ

Noura sat with her mother at the dining table, waiting for the rest of the family. The mother began repeating prayers upon the Prophet ﷺ.

Noura: What are you saying, mother?

Mother: While waiting, I fill my time with praying on our Master, Muhammad ﷺ.

Noura: Why do we pray upon the Prophet ﷺ?

Mother: Prayer upon the Prophet ﷺ is a highly virtuous act, my daughter. For each prayer we send to the Prophet ﷺ we are given the reward of ten good deeds, ten bad deeds are forgiven for us, and all concerns and sorrows are removed from us. It is the reason for bringing good news to a person that he will go to Paradise, his needs will be satisfied, and his supplications will be answered. Prayer upon him ﷺ will bring us nearer to him on the Day of Judgement.

Noura: What should I say when I pray upon the Prophet ﷺ?

Mother: The best form of prayer upon the Prophet ﷺ is what we say in the Assalat Al-Ibrahimiyyah:

Allahumma Salli 3ala Muhamadin wa 3ala aali Muhamadin kamaa sallayta 3ala Ibrahim wa 3ala aalibrahim, wa baarik 3ala Muhamadin wa 3ala aali Muhamadin kamaa baarakta 3ala Ibrahim wa 3ala aali Ibrahim innaka 7ameedun majeed. “O Allah! Send blessings upon Muhammad and upon the family of Muhammad as You sent blessings upon Abraham and upon the family of Abraham; indeed, You are praiseworthy and glorious.

O Allah! Bless Muhammad and the family of Muhammad as You blessed Abraham and the family of Abraham; indeed, You are praiseworthy and glorious."

Or you may say: "Blessings and peace of Allah be upon him (ﷺ)."

Noura: Blessings and peace of Allah be upon him! What is the meaning of this prayer, mother?

Mother: It is a supplication in favor of the Prophet ﷺ.

On the Day of Judgement, He will uncover what they are hiding in their minds and reward them all for it.
