The Jungle Café



Grammatical structure	Modals of ability (can)
Usage	We use it to talk about things that we are able to do.
Other examples	Please <u>can</u> I go to the second floor? I <u>can</u> run and jump. What <u>can</u> we do in the city?

Present simple

I <u>play</u> football every day. I <u>live</u> in a flat. The pictures <u>are</u> next to the table.	
Grammatical structure	Present simple tense, including the verb 'to be'
Usage	It is used to describe habits and routines and to tell facts about things.
Other examples	Alia <u>has</u> two aunts and four cousins. We <u>don't like</u> small houses. I <u>am</u> happy.

Adverb of frequency

My brother <u>never</u> eats chocolate ice-cream. Fatima <u>always</u> helps her mother after school. We <u>usually</u> have pancakes for breakfast.	
Grammatical structure	Adverbs (frequency)
Usage	They are used to describe how often people repeat certain actions.
Other examples	Ali <u>usually</u> plays tennis, but <u>sometimes</u> he plays football, too. I <u>often</u> go to a café with my sister. My brothers <u>sometimes</u> watches TV in the evening.


