Part 1 of the Reading Summative Assessment is a narrative text. The purpose of a narrative text is to entertain rather than inform. It can be a literary text, involving a story written from either a first- or third-person perspective. This text type is characterised by informal language, direct speech, characters and plot.

Part 2

Part 2 of the Reading Assessment is an informative text. This text type's purpose is to impart information and it has a lot of facts. The language used can be informal (blog posts, for example, can be informative texts) or formal (newspaper articles or academic journals can also be informative texts). Informative texts can be written from a first-person perspective (blog posts and reports, for example) or can be formal and impersonal (articles).

Part 3

Part 3 of the assessment is a MAZE. This is a short informative text with nine gaps in the sentences that assess students' proficiency in level-specific grammar, functional language and lexis. This assessment type is called a MAZE because it is a textual maze. Students need to be able to make the right 'turns' within a short text by selecting the correct word or words to complete sentences. It requires students to make connections between different parts of a text and apply their skills and knowledge in an integrated, authentic way.

This is a MAZE **1** (text / texting / texts). The climate of the UAE is a desert climate with hot summers and cool winters. Most of the days are warm and sunny. However, in the middle of the summer, in July and August, it is very hot.

In the UAE, summer season starts in late May and lasts until September. The weather is hot with temperatures that can reach up to 45°C. During the winter season an average daytime temperature is 25°C. The maximum temperature is about 30°C, while the minimum temperature is around 15°C. The UAE's climate is very dry. Survey: How We Use Computers

Technology is everywhere. It is in our homes and in our schools. Some people say that we use computers too much. Some people say that we should use them more. These are just two opinions. But what is the truth? How much do we really use them? And what do we use them for?

We surveyed 1,470 middle school students to find out how much they use computers, and why they use them. The results are interesting.

According to the survey, all 1,470 middle school students use computers at school and at home. We asked them how many hours they spend on the computer in a week. 53% said that they spend 3-15 hours each week on the computer. 37% said that they spend 16-25 hours on the computer each week. Only 1% said 0-2 hours, and 9% spend more than 25 hours per week on the computer.

Finally, we wanted to know why middle school students use computers. Do they send emails? Do they study? Do they play games? Only 2% said that they send emails, but 98% said that they use the computer to study and play games.

Are students using computers for good reasons? According to the survey, 78% of students spend 90% of their computer time studying. We think this is good news.

Every two years there is either a Winter Olympic Games with sports played on ice or snow, or a Summer Olympic Games with a variety of indoor and outdoor sports.

The name of the Olympic Games comes from the Ancient Greek city Olympia where the games were held every four years from the 8th Century BCE until the 5th Century CE. The first modern Olympics happened in 1896 in Athens, Greece. The first, second and third place finishers in each sport, known as 'events,' receive gold, silver and bronze medals.
