

1- COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES

One-syllable (short adjectives) and most two-syllable adjectives take **-er**.

Adjectives with three or more syllables (long adjectives) take more.



What is the rule?



The Eiffel tower in France is taller than The Eiffel tower in Texas.

Sub +Verb+adj+er + than 'to be'

The Eiffel tower in France is more impressive than The Eiffel tower in Texas

Our old sofa isn't as comfortable as our new sofa.

We use 'as + adj + as' to compare two things that are the same.



Ahmed is as tall as Tariq.

Note: the base (POSITIVE) form of the adjective word is used with as as. Examples:

- 1. She is as tall as her friend.
- Your school subjects are as easy as mine.
