Part 2: Preparation - Grammar

You can see a camel and an elephant if you go to the zoo.

Grammatical structure	Determiners: indefinite article (a/an) a / an + noun
Usage	The indefinite article (<i>a</i> , <i>an</i>) is used before a noun that is not known.
Meaning	This person is talking about all / any camels and elephants.
Other examples	He likes to read <u>a</u> book in his free time. She wants to take <u>a</u> photo of the mountains. You must go to the shop to buy <u>an</u> orange.

INDEFINITE ARTICLES

The indefinite article (*a*, *an*) is used before a noun that is not known. We talk about all / any of them.

a ladder

a map

a plan



an apartment

an umbrella

A-E-I-O-U

Did you enjoy your holiday?

Yes, the hotel was great, and the food was wonderful. There was a spider in the shower, though!

Grammatical structure	Determiners: definite article (the) the + noun
Usage	A definite article (the) shows that the reader knows the specific, individual noun being described. For example, if your parents ask you to feed 'the' dog, they are talking about your pet and not any dog in the neighbourhood.
Meaning	This person is talking specifically about the objects they used, not any hotel, food or shower.
Other examples	“Ali, please wash <u>the</u> car. It is dirty!” I am at <u>the</u> library now. When we came home <u>the</u> letter from you was waiting for me.

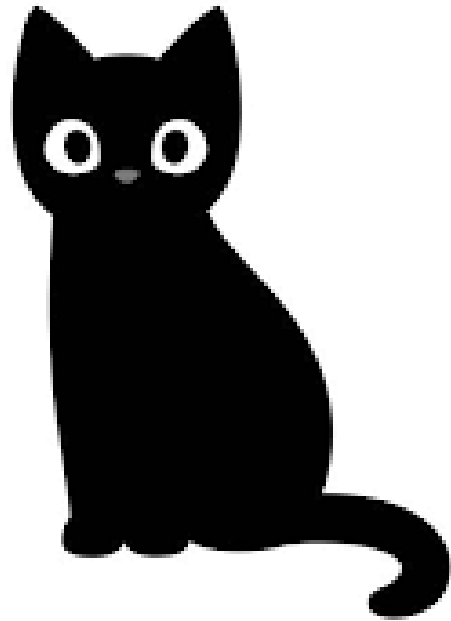
DEFINITE ARTICLES

The definite article (*the*) is used before a noun that is known. We talk about the one we know.

Indefinite Article

The **indefinite article** tells us something is non-specific.

a an



a thief

This is any thief. He's not known to the writer or the readers.

The **definite article** tells us something is specific.

the



the thief

This is a specific thief. The writer and readers know about him.

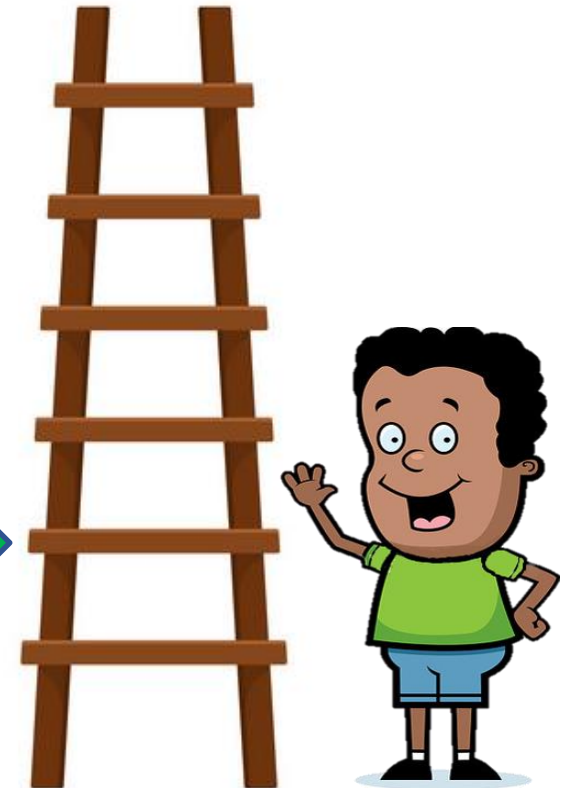

Grammatical structure	Coordinating Conjunctions subject + verb + object, [coordinating conjunction] subject + verb + object.
Usage	Conjunctions are joining words that link together parts of a sentence. However, the parts need to make sense on their own. and : connects two sentences (addition) but : states either a condition or a contrast (contrast)
Meaning	He watches TV in the living room. He doesn't do homework in the living room.
Other examples	Khalid reads the newspaper <u>and</u> watches television every Friday. I like science lessons, <u>but</u> I don't like history lessons.

COORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS

Conjunctions are joining words that link together parts of a sentence.



and: connects two sentences (addition)

but: connects either a condition or a contrast (contrast)  

and

He watches TV in the living room. He does homework in the living room.

He watches TV ~~in the living room~~ **and** ~~he~~ does homework in the living room.

but



He watches TV in the living room. He doesn't do homework in the living room.

He watches TV ~~in the living room~~ **but** ~~he~~ doesn't do homework in the living room.
