Sleep Scientists

Sleep scientists find out what happens to people when they don't get enough sleep. They collect information about how much sleep people need. This helps to keep people safe when they are doing important jobs, like doctors, firefighters .and police officers

Sleep scientist use people called "testers" to help study sleep. The testers don't sleep in their homes. They sleep in laboratories, and have special machines attached to them. The scientists watch them sleep all night. The machines give the scientist information about how well the person is .sleeping

Before the testers go to sleep, the scientists have them do a test on a computer. The testers fall asleep at midnight. At 4 o'clock in the morning, they wake up to do another test on the computer. Five hours later, the testers do another test on .the computer

The testers stay awake all day until midnight. It's very hard for .the testers to stay awake so long
