Conditional

Conditional is a type of sentence that is made of an Ifclause (condition) and a main clause (result)

If it rains, I will stay at home

a main clause

If-clause

The sentence describe a situation that might happen.

The sentence usually starts with if.

If it rains, I will stay at home.

Note that the if-clause can be first or the second part of the sentence.

I will stay at home if it rains.

1st conditional

if + present simple + will/won't + verb

Refers to a situation that is possible or realistic.

Example

If I go to the shops, I will buy something.

If I study hard, I will pass my exams.

1st conditional with if

We use the first conditional to express future events that are likely to happen. We form the structure with

if + present simple + will/won't + verb

If you drink plenty of water, you'll be able to concentrate better in class.

Your body won't grow as well if you stay up late every night.
