know + that + rest of sentence

knew +that + rest of sentences

### 5. Present time: present perfect continuous

have / has + been + verb (-ing) + for / since + time expression

**I have been working as an engineer for ten years.**

### 6. Present perfect simple

has / have + past participle

### 1. Adverbs: degree

‘such a / such’ + (adjective) + noun phrase

‘so’ + adjective / adverb

‘so’ + ‘many / much / little / few’ + noun phrase

**Yesterday, I went to Global Village with my family. It was such a fun day!**

2. They worked (so many-so much - so little) faster after lunch.
3. The restaurant had (so – such- few) wonderful food.
4. He is (such - such a- so) good brother. He always brings me chocolates when he visits.

## 2. Present time: present continuous

subject + am / is / are + adverb of frequency + verb-ing

**I don't see my older sister enough. She's always studying!**

1. This computer (is working never -is never working – never is working) properly!
2. She (are always -is always) worrying.
3. My brother is usually (play – played - playing) computer games when I go to visit him.

## 3. Past time: past continuous

subject + was / were + verb-ing

**My family were living in France during the pandemic.**

1. I (am – were - was) studying for my exam last week.
2. They were (shop -shopped – shopping) in the mall at that time.
3. I (was doing – was done – am doing) my degree in 2016.

## 4. Conjunctions: subordinating

so + adjective / quantifier + that clause

**It was raining so hard that we had to go inside.**

1. The ice cream was (such -so – very) sweet that I felt unwell.
2. After school, I was so tired (that- this- the) I went straight home.
3. The music was -----(loud) it gave me a headache.
4. She ate ----- (much) she fell asleep.

## 5. Conjunctions: subordinating

clause + in order to + verb phrase (infinitive)

**In order to please her mother, Fatima helped to prepare dinner.**

1. She walks to school each day in order to (saving – saves – save) money.
2. He studied hard (because – so - in order to) pass the science exam.
3. Khalid travelled to Abu Dhabi (so that – therefore- in order to) visit his grandmother.

#### 6. Passive: present perfect

object + has / have + (just / already) + been + past participle

**The movie has already been seen by many people in the class.**

1. (Had – Have -Has) it already been collected today?
2. The exams (has -have – had) already been marked.
3. He just (has been – have just been -has just been) told about it.

#### 7. Passive: present perfect

object + has / have (not)+ been + past participle + yet

**I haven't been told about it yet.**

1. They (hasn't- hadn't -haven't) been found yet.
2. That hasn't (being -been- be) fixed yet.
3. It hasn't been (decide - decision – decided) yet.
