1 Learn about it.

When we talk about where people are from, we talk about their 'nationality'. To make a 'nationality', we must change the noun to an adjective. There are some rules for making nationalities.



For countries that end with -land, change the ending to -ish:

Ireland → Irish Finland → Finnish

For countries that end with an -n sound, add an -ese to their name:

Sudan → Sudanese Japan → Japanese

For countries that end with vowel sounds, add an -an to their name:

Korea → Korean Australia → Australian

For countries in the Persian Gulf, add an -i to their name:

Yemen → Yemeni Iraq → Iraqi

There are some irregular words:

France → French Denmark → Danish

- How many workers helped build the Taj Mahal?



Twenty two thousand Indian, Persian, Turkish and Iraqi workers worked together for more than 20 years to build the Taj Mahal.
