- 1) Being lost in an unfamiliar forest or remote area can be frightening, but staying calm and taking the right steps will increase your chances of a safe rescue. Here are some tips for surviving if you become stranded in the wilderness.
 - 2) The first thing to do is stop and try to get your bearings. Take a look around and see if there are any landmarks like mountains, bodies of water, or trails that can help you determine which direction safety lies. Listen closely for the sound of vehicles in the distance that could point you toward civilization. Make sure to stay in one place so rescuers have a smaller area to search. Moving around aimlessly will only cause you to become more lost.
 - 3) Once you've determined you don't immediately recognize where you are, it's time to prepare a shelter. Look for natural materials like evergreen branches, bark, or broad tree leaves to make a small lean-to or covering to protect yourself from elements like rain or cold weather. You'll also want to prepare kindling and gather firewood in case of nightfall or dropping temperatures. Most matches and lighters are waterproof, so keep them safely stored for when darkness comes.
 - 4) For nutrition, focus on finding a water source like a stream, river, or standing water. Purify any water by boiling it or adding purification tablets so you don't risk illness from microbes. Berries and some plants like dandelions are edible in moderation in forest areas, but avoid eating anything unfamiliar as poisoning is a real danger without the right plant identification. Set up small snares or traps near your camp to catch small game like rabbits if possible.
 - 5) Staying put and visible is key to being found quickly. Build a large signal fire if you have enough kindling, or stack branches in the shape of an SOS sign at the highest viewpoint. Periodically shout or make loud noises like whistling to attract notice. With positive thinking and utilising survival skills, rescue is almost always imminent for those lost in the wilderness when they remain calm and take the right steps to ensure their safety until help arrives.
