As the world of technology, fashion and politics changes, new words get coined every day.

Man's interest in travelling backwards and forwards in time has been the subject of science, philosophy and literature over the centuries. It was probably H.G. The appeal of the shopping mall is obvious. Free from traffic and the elements, they conveniently provide everything you need under one roof. The mall as we know it today is a twentieth-century phenomenon, but covered markets have a long history. Laughing is a universal phenomenon that breaks down barriers, unites people and is generally infectious, without any side effects. Doctors agree that a good dose of laughter can contribute to good health and feeling well, but is there any real scientific basis for recommending laughter as a valid medicine?

The field of psychoneuroimmunology is the study of how psychological factors, the brain and the immune system, interact to influence health. It is now universally accepted that laughter can reduce blood pressure, reduce harmful stress hormones and boost the immune system. According to the findings of a recent survey of UK secondary school children, successful teachers have specific personality characteristics and behaviours. There's nothing better than a fresh fish supper, but as more and more people consume fish, the world's supply is at risk. Widespread overfishing has been identified as a major environmental problem. Global stocks of most fish are being seriously reduced and 70% of species are being overfished.

Though many people around the world still use lowtech approaches to fishing, most fishing is being carried out by large industrial fishing fleets. Visiting a Japanese home

Before visiting a Japanese home it is important to know something about Japanese etiquette. A good starting point is the traditional greeting of bowing. A bow can range from a long bow, a 90 degree bend from the waist to show utmost respect to someone of a high social status, to a small nod of the head for informal situations. Handshakes are rare. When entering a Japanese home, after an initial greeting you usually leave your outdoor shoes at the doorway. Solar power is the conversion of sunlight into energy and is by far the world's most available energy source. It is a renewable fuel and eco-friendly. Because solar power depends on lots of sunshine, it is not surprising that Spain, one of the sunniest countries in Europe, is one of the most advanced countries in solar energy development and is the world's fourth manufacturer of solar power technology.

Art for children with learning difficulties

Art is more than just play. It gives children, and especially those with learning difficulties, a means to develop their confidence and self-esteem, which helps improve their overall academic and social abilities. One of the key benefits of using art therapy is that it provides an opportunity for children to express themselves through nonverbal communication, overcoming many physical and cognitive impediments.
